Mayor Fox called the meeting to order, led the Pledge of Allegiance and read the OPMA statement

CORRESPONDANCE:

Clerk provided the Commissioners with a copy of the Certificate of Determination and Award to Issue Bond Anticipation Note

Clerk informed the Commissioners that a petition was filed against Ordinance 534(2014), to repeal it or put it to a referendum. It is in proper form and has enough signatures. Mayor explained to the public that the Ordinance was for street repairs; raised manholes; message sign at bridge. Mayor was very disappointed that the Borough can't move forward due to a handful of people, including former Mayor Frederick and Former Commissioner McNamara. Comm. Golden commented that our hands are tied. You must bond for the money for large projects like this, because there is not enough money in the regular budget to do these projects. There have been several cars with undercarriage damage, so we had to put warning barrels on the manholes.

Reports from Commissioners:

Mayor gave the Police Activity Report for the month of July (copy attached).

Comm. Maxwell informed the pubic of the Fire Company and Ladies Auxiliary Open House, and asked Maureen Smith, Ladies Aux. President to provide further details. She informed the public that it is Sat., Aug. 9th from 1-5pm, they will be having a cake sale at that time, the proceeds will benefit the Auxiliary, who in turn support the Fire Company. She also reported that the profits made from the family festival were split equally between the Fire Company, Auxiliary and Borough festival fund.

Comm. Golden reported that 79 work orders were performed for the month of July (copy attached) and if anyone wants a copy of the report it is available.

Mayor opened the meeting to floor for public comment.

<u>ANN BROADBENT</u>, 550 W. Pine Avenue, asked if the Ordinance can be put on the ballot. Mayor explained that there is still in litigation and it may be court ordered to put that one on the ballot. Mayor doesn't want two questions on the ballot.

<u>ELAINE SZYMKOWIAK</u>, 555 W. Magnolia Avenue, asked if Magnolia Avenue was on this one. Comm. Golden stated that it was.

<u>MAUREEN SMITH</u>, 30 Venice Avenue, If it is going to Supreme Court, what would we have done this winter without the equipment. If it goes on the ballot in November, I feel it would pass. Mayor stated that the loaders were in that bond, and we have a 3.9 cent increase partly because the Judge ordered the Borough to put the money back. Comm. Golden stated that the money then had to come out the regular operating budget.

<u>DOLORES BORKOWSKI</u>, 517 W. Poplar Avenue, asked why her taxes went up \$740.00. Mayor informed her that the local purpose tax increase was 3.9 cents. The other increases were for school tax, county tax and library tax, making a total a little more than 8 cents. Mayor confirmed that she lives on Poplar Avenue.

JOE SMITH, 30 Venice Avenue, Tell her how many have been blocked.

<u>LEO SCANLAN</u>, 645 W. Glenwood Avenue, questioned if the Borough got a price to do Poplar Avenue, and can you just do the \$ 173,000 worth of work. Comm. Golden stated that engineer estimates are around \$ 250,000 and that the Borough would get a cheaper cost to do it all at one time.

<u>BOB STEPHANIE</u>, 714 W. Glenwood Avenue, Questioned why can't you only do the \$173,000, and what happens if the Borough loses the money. Comm. Golden informed him that the Borough must borrow the money first. Mayor stated that the rules are governed by the state.

Former Senator Cafiero informed the public that the law allows for Bonds Anticipation Notes, to lengthen the time for paying for projects; the larger the amount borrowed the better rate. BAN is temporary funding, and that the Borough would pay more if the projects were done piecemeal.

<u>BERNADETTE LICATA</u>, 627 W. Poplar Avenue, asked how they got the money for the bonds.

Mayor informed the public that three signers on the petition live on Poplar Avenue.

<u>LEO SCANLAN</u>, 645 W. Glenwood Avenue, Thanked the DPW and Tax Office for getting the street sign replaced at H and Glenwood.

<u>DOLORES BORKOWSKI</u>, 517 W. Poplar Avenue, asked how many people can be in a rental home, and questioned off-street and boat slip parking.

Former Senator Cafiero informed the Commissioners and the public that there is a Tenant Law on the books in which the Municipal Judge can terminate a lease, if the violate ordinances. The Mayor asked if he could get a copy of that law.

Hearing no more public comment, the Mayor closed the public portion of the meeting.

Dear Sir/Madam:

Enclosed please find Petitions, properly verified, containing signatures of approximately forty-five (45) registered voters of the Borough of West Wildwood. The enclosed are submitted pursuant to the provisions of New Jersey Statutes. The Petitioners demand the repeal of Ordinance No. 534(2014) or, if not repealed, submitted to the voters by way of referendum.

The New Jersey Statutes require that the Petitions be signed by not less than fifteen (15%) percent of the entire vote cast in the Borough of West Wildwood at the last preceding general election in which members of the General Assembly were elected. I am advised by the Cape May County Board of Elections that the last such general election was held on November 5, 2013 and that the total number of votes cast in West Wildwood was two hundred thirty-six (236). Fifteen (15%) percent of two hundred thirty-six (236) equals thirty-five (35) required signatures on the Petitions. The enclosed Petitions contain considerably more than that number.

The enclosed must immediately be presented to the Board of Commissioners which must reconsider the subject Ordinance within twenty (20) days. If the Ordinance is not entirely repealed, the Board must submit the Ordinance to a vote of the electors.

As I am certain that you are aware, the referenced Ordinance could not be effective until twenty (20) days after the publication of the Board's adoption on July 6, 2014. Due to submission of the enclosed, pursuant to New Jersey Statutes the Ordinance cannot become operative unless a majority of the qualified electors voting on the Ordinance shall vote in favor thereof.

OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING

\$603,600 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE

ISSUANCE OF \$584,720 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE

BOROUGH TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST

THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST WILDWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of West Wildwood, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey (the "Borough") as general improvements. For the several improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriation made for each improvement or purpose, such sums amounting in the aggregate to \$603,600, including \$173,000 received as a New Jersey Department of Transportation grant (the "State Grant"), and further including the aggregate sum of

The excess of the appropriation made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the amount of the down payment for each purpose.

or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are all improvements or purposes that the Borough may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness, computed on the basis of the respective amounts of obligations authorized for each purpose and the reasonable life thereof within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, is 10.10 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$584,720, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$113,200 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purposes or improvements.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the this bond ordinance. Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF WEST. WILDWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$1,254,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,205,160 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO PINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST WILDWOOD, INTIME COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of West Wildwood, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey (the "Borough") as general improvements. For the overal improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriation made for each improvement or purpose, such sums amounting in the aggregate to \$1,254,000, including a \$173,250 grant expected to be received from the State of New Jersey Department of Transportation for the purpose in Section 3(d) (the "State Grant") and further including the aggregate sum of \$48,840 as the several down payments for the improvements or purposes required by the Local Bond Law. No down

payment is required for the purpose described in Section 3(d) hereof, as such purpose is being partially funded by the State Grant. The amount of the down payment appropriated is 5% of the \$976,800 in costs of the improvements which are not to be funded by the State Grant. The down payments have been made available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the several improvements or purposes not covered by application of the several down payments and in anticipation of receipt of the State Grant, negotiable bonds are thereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$1,205,160 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The several improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for which the bonds are to be issued the estimated cost of each improvement and the appropriation therefor, the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each improvement and the period of usefulness of each improvement are as follows:

The excess of the appropriation made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds of notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the amount of the down payment for each purpose.

Section 4. All bond inticipation notes is a provided that no bond times as may be determined by the chief imancial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one-year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued

interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The Borough hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated.

- (a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are all improvements or purposes that the Borough may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness, computed on the basis of the respective amounts of obligations authorized for each purpose and the reasonable life thereof within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, is 10.23 years.

- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$1,205,160, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$209,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purposes or improvements.

Section 7. The Borough hereby declares the intent of the Borough to issue bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reinburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes or improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations.

Section 8. Any grant moneys received for the purposes or improvements described in Section 3 half of shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements of the payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 9. The chief financial officer of the Borough is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document

to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Borough and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough fails to comply with its undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any pronetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific parformance of the undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of circle the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.
