**ORDINANCE NO. 530(2014)** 

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 513(2011) KNOWN AS "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE REGISTRATION AND LICENSING OF DOGS AND PROVIDING THE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF."

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of West Wildwood has reviewed the existing Ordinance of the Borough pertaining to and governing the licensing of dogs and the penalties related thereto;

WHEREAS, the review of Ordinance No. 513(2011) under Section III, Regulations for the Registration and Licensing of Dogs, and Penalties for Violations Thereof, revealed that a state mandated charge of \$ .20 for the N.J. Clinic fee was inadvertently omitted;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of West Wildwood in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey the following amendment to Ordinance No. 513(2011), Section III is a follows:

<u>Initial Fee</u>: In addition to the existing fees as per Ordinance 513(2011) pertaining to N.J.S.A. 4-19-15, regulating dog license fees, an additional charge of \$.20 will be collected and forwarded to the State of New Jersey for the N.J. Clinic Fund.

**SECTION I.** Severability. If for any reason any section of this Ordinance shall be declared illegal by any Court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining section of the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect, notwithstanding.

**SECTION II.** Repealer. Any Ordinance or provision thereof inconsistent with this Ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

**SECTION III. Publication**. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon the adoption and publication in accordance with the law.

#### **RESOLUTION 2014-034**

#### A RESOLUTION URGING OUR U.S. HOUSE MEMBERS TO VOTE "YES" ON THE HOMEOWNER FLOOD INSURANCE AFFORDABILITY ACT OF 2014, H.R. 3370 (as amended)

WHEREAS, the U.S. House of Representatives is poised to begin debate this week on the Homeowner Flood Insurance Affordability Act of 2014 (H.R. 3370, as amended); and

WHEREAS, H.R. 3370 was originally introduced as a companion bill to the Senate measure (S. 1926) – also known as the Homeowner Flood Insurance Affordability Act of 2014. However, the original legislative text has been replaced with completely new language. The amended bill will be considered under a procedure that will require a 2/3 majority vote to pass and does not allow for any amendments; and

WHEREAS, H.R. 3370 (as amended) contains several provisions that would address county concerns:

- \*Reinstates Grandfathering: The House bill would permanently repeal Biggert-Waters' phase-out of grandfathered policies and thus would allow grandfathering of policies to continue. This means that post-FIRM properties built to code at the time of construction may have the ability to grandfather into a lower premium.
- \*Removes Sales Trigger: The house bill would discontinue the practice of fully actualizing rates at the point of sale, meaning the sales "trigger" is removed; this would ensure premium insurance rate certainty at the point of sale.
- \*Retroactively Refunds Policyholders: The House bill would retroactively refund some Pre-FIRM policyholders if they paid a higher premium under Biggert-Waters.
- \*Allows for Annual Surcharge: The House bill would institute a \$25.00 annual surcharge for all NFIP primary home policy holders and a \$250 annual surcharge on all second homes and businesses. All revenue from these surcharges goes toward the NFIP reserve fund, established to meet the future obligations of the NFIP.
- \*Requires Affordability Study and Provides Additional Funding for the Study: The House bill would increase funding for FEMA to complete an affordability study from \$750,000 (under Biggert-Waters) to \$3 million. The measure would also reaffirm that the study be completed in two years; and
- WHEREAS, the purpose of the Biggert-Waters Act of 2012 (BW-12) was to make FEMA's National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), which faced a deficit of \$24 billion, solvent. However, BW-12 resulted in some unintended consequences for local governments, residents and businesses; and

WHEREAS, a number of the nation's 3,069 counties, both coastal and inland, have stated that

their homeowners and businesses are facing drastically increasing annual NFIP flood insurance premiums due to BW-12's phase-outs of subsidized premium rates. According to the Government Accountability Office, properties in 2,930 counties had subsidized policies as of June, 2012, and

WHEREAS, as the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), which oversees the NFIP program, continues to update its Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs), more low-lying areas may begin to face drastic premium rate increases in the near future; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of West Wildwood supports a sustainable, fiscally responsible NFIP that protects the businesses and homeowners who built according to code and have followed all applicable laws. We also support amending BW-12 in a way that keeps flood insurance rates affordable while balancing the fiscal solvency of the program. Additionally, West Wildwood supports reinstating the grandfathering of properties (not policies) that were built to code, have maintained insurance and have not repeatedly flooded.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Governing Body of the Borough of West Wildwood, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, strongly urges our N.J. House Members in The U.S. House of Representatives to vote YES on the Homeowner Flood Insurance Affordability Act of 2014 (H.R. 3370, as amended).

#### **RESOLUTION 2014-037**

#### A RESOLUTION CALLING ON THE LEGISLATURE TO MAKE PERMANENT THE 2% CAP ON INTEREST ARBITRATION AWARDS

**WHEREAS**, on December 21, 2010, Governor Christie signed into law reforms to the Arbitration process that took effect January 1, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the reforms capped arbitration awards on economic factors to no more than 2%, provided for random selection of arbitrators, expedited the determination of awards, required the arbitrator to provide a written report detailing the weight accorded to each of the required considerations and expedited the appeal process; and

**WHEREAS**, these reforms marked a dramatic change to the arbitration process and have helped municipalities to control the never-ending rise in public safety personnel costs; and

**WHEREAS**, a key element of the reforms, capping arbitration awards on economic factors to no more than 2% of the property tax levy will expire on April 1, 2014; and

WHEREAS, while municipalities are statutorily limited to raise their property tax levy by no more than 2%, with very limited exceptions, failure to extend the 2% cap on interest arbitration awards will force municipalities throughout the State to further reduce or even eliminate crucial services, personnel, and long-overdue infrastructure improvement projects in order to fund an arbitration award; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2% Interest Arbitration cap has controlled one of the largest municipal expense, public safety salaries, not only through arbitration awards but through contract negotiations; and

**WHEREAS**, absent further action by the Legislature, any contract that expires on or after April 1, 2014, will be subject to all new procedures and requirements, EXCEPT the 2% awards cap; and

WHEREAS, without those limits, arbitrators will be able to impose awards that do not account for the 2% limit on the property tax levy, which would immediately threaten funding for all other municipal services; and

WHEREAS, without the 2% cap on Interest Arbitration Awards but with the 2% cap on property tax levy local budget makers could be forced to reduce other essential municipal services to fund an arbitration award;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the governing body of the Borough of West Wildwood strongly urges the Legislature to permanently extend the 2% cap on interest arbitration awards prior to the April 1, 2014 sunset; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that a that a copy of this duly adopted resolution be forwarded to Senate President Stephen Sweeney, Assembly Speaker Vincent Prieto, the State Legislative representatives, Governor Chris Christie, and the New Jersey State League of Municipalities.
