**DISCUSSION:**

Clerk reviewed agenda items for the regular meeting on Friday. There are second readings/public hearings on Ordinance 538(2015); Ordinance 539(2015); Ordinance 540(2015). There was a discussion on several other matters that need attention. Clerk inquired as to the status of an updated bulkhead ordinance. Solicitor will draft several ordinances for introduction at the regular meeting; one for COAH regulations, one for setting fees for certifications and certified copies of vital records and an application, he will also amend the current Mercantile License Ordinance 508(2011) changing the Non-Profit Soliciting fee of \$50.00 to be able to be waived at the discretion of the Commissioners; along with correcting Section XVI, omitting the wording that the Ordinance shall take effect with the approval of the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority.

Clerk then brought up several matters for resolutions, including JIF contact persons appointment; amending the temporary budget to reflect a line item to pay previous years bills; opposing NJ Senate bill S2076 and NJ Assembly bill A3358; authorizing the Borough Engineer to prepare and file a CMC Open Space; acknowledging members of WWFC and Auxiliary persons for JIF; appointment of Borough Tax Collector, and the possibility of transfers. Clerk informed the Commissioners that we have an unaudited credit with the CMCMA waste water collection of \$6,745.00.

Mayor asked the Solicitor about the possibility of doing a resolution acknowledging the settlement for the Perloff case. A brief discussion ensued, with the clarification by the Solicitor that he has an e-mail communication from Mr. Merenich, the attorney assigned by JIF that the Borough will not incur any costs in this settlement matter. Solicitor will have this for the April meeting.

Comm. Maxwell gave the Police Activity Report for the month of February (copy attached). He also gave the Fire Company report for January and February 2015 (copy attached). He informed the public that our tax collection rate for 2014 was near 95% and commended Terry, our tax collector.

She informed the public that the Spaghetti dinner will be rescheduled for some time in May, and that the Soup and ½ of a sandwich lunch fundraiser is March 21, between the hours of 11:30am and 1:30pm, it also includes crackers, a beverage and dessert.

ELAINE SZYMKOWIAK, 555 W. Magnolia Avenue, Thanked the Borough for the snow removal, although her husband cleared the sidewalk prior to the borough, Max and Chris cleared out the driveway.

MR. ROLLICK, 748 W. Glenwood Avenue, also thanked the Borough on behalf of the senior citizens for shoveling the snow.

COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, PROVIDING  
FOR THE RAISING OF THE AMOUNTS THEREOF BY TAXATION  
AND PROVIDING FOR THE TIME AND METHOD OF PAYMENT  
THEREOF.**

**BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of West Wildwood, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey, the Governing Body of the Borough of West Wildwood, as follows:

**Section 1.** The salaries and compensation to be paid to the elective officers and appointive officers and employees of the Borough of West Wildwood, in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey, shall be within the ranges specified herein; said salary or compensation shall be paid no more frequently than bi-weekly, and shall be paid by check, signed by, at least two Borough Commissioners and either the Clerk or Deputy Clerk.

**Section 2.** All fees of any said officers for services required by him or her by Ordinance or Resolution of the governing body shall, within the calendar month of the receipt by him or her, be paid into the Borough Treasury by each officer for the use of the Borough, provided however, that his section shall not apply to officers herein mentioned who are paid their compensation in fees.

**Section 3.** The following designated elective and appointive officials and employees of the Borough of West Wildwood from and after the adoption thereof, shall be paid an annual salary in full compensation for all services rendered, other than for those services which may be subject to a separate contract, as follows:

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL  
IMPROVEMENTS IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF WEST  
WILDWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW  
JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$450,000 THEREFOR AND  
AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$440,000 BONDS OR  
NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO FINANCE PART OF THE  
COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH BOROUGH BOARD OF  
COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST WILDWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF  
CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively  
concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of West Wildwood, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey (the "Borough") as general improvements. For the several improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriation made for each improvement or purpose, such sums amounting in the aggregate to \$450,000, including a grant expected to be received from the State of New Jersey Department of Transportation for the purpose in Section 3(b) (the "State Grant") and further including the aggregate sum of \$10,000 as the several down payments for

the improvements or purposes required by the Local Bond Law. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c), no down payment is provided for the cost of the improvement or purpose in Section 3(b) since it is being partially funded by the State Grant. The amount of the down payment is 5% of the costs of the improvements or purposes not covered by the State Grant (\$200,000). The down payments have been made available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the several improvements or purposes not covered by application of the several down payments and in anticipation of receipt of the State Grant, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$440,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The several improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for which the bonds are to be issued, the estimated cost of each improvement and the appropriation therefor, the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each improvement and the period of usefulness of each improvement are as follows:

The excess of the appropriation made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the amount of the down payment for each purpose.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The Borough hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital

or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are all improvements or purposes that the Borough may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness, computed on the basis of the respective amounts of obligations authorized for each purpose and the reasonable life thereof within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, is 10.53 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$440,000, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$90,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purposes or improvements.



Section 7. The Borough hereby declares the intent of the Borough to issue bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes or improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations.

Section 8. Any grant moneys received for the purposes or improvements described in Section 3 hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 9. The chief financial officer of the Borough is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Borough and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough fails to comply with its undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.



**ORDINANCE TO REPEAL ORDINANCE 508 (2011), ORDINANCE 453, ORDINANCE 371, ORDINANCE 269 AND ORDINANCE 139 OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST WILDWOOD AND ANY OF THEIR AMENDMENTS, AND TO FURTHER ISSUE THIS NEW ORDINANCE TO BE KNOWN AS "THE MERCANTILE LICENSE ORDINANCE."**

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of West Wildwood has reviewed the existing Ordinances of the Borough pertaining to the issuance of mercantile licenses and the fees relating thereto;

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of West Wildwood has deemed it necessary and in the best interest of the citizens of West Wildwood to revise and consolidate existing licensing requirements and the fees relating thereto, pertaining to the operation of commercial activities in the Borough of West Wildwood.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of West Wildwood, in the County of Cape May, and State of New Jersey as follows:

**SECTION I.** All statements of the preamble are incorporated herein as if set forth at length.

**SECTION II.** Ordinance 139, and all of its amendments, is hereby repealed.

**SECTION III.** Ordinance 269, and all of its amendments, is hereby repealed.

**SECTION IV.** Ordinance 371, and all of its amendments, is hereby repealed.

**SECTION V.** Ordinance 453, and all of its amendments, is hereby repealed.

**SECTION VI.** Ordinance 508(2011), and all of its amendments, is hereby repealed.

**SECTION VII.** General Mercantile License Requirements and Regulations.

1. License Required.

Any person conducting a business or commercial activity within the Borough of West Wildwood, either directly or indirectly, must first obtain

a mercantile license, except in those cases where a different license is required by any provision of this Ordinance, any other Ordinance of the Borough of West Wildwood, or any statute of the State of New Jersey.

2. Conducting a Business or Commercial Activity.

For purposes of this Ordinance, a person, or his employee, clerk, or agent, will be deemed to be conducting a business or a commercial activity by:

- a. the selling, consigning or renting of any goods or services, including the providing or offering for possession or occupancy of dwellings, rooms, units, sleeping accommodations or boatslips;
- b. soliciting business or offering any goods or services for sale, rent or lease; or
- c. using any vehicle within the Borough of West Wildwood for the purposes outlined in a. and b. of this subsection.

3. Application for Mercantile License.

Every person who is required to obtain a mercantile license must submit an application to the Borough Clerk along with the required fee. The fee schedule attached hereto as "Schedule A" provides the fees required for each application. Column A applies to those applications received on or prior to the thirtieth (30<sup>th</sup>) of April, and Column B applies to those received after the thirtieth (30<sup>th</sup>) of April, in each calendar year. The application form can be obtained from the Borough Clerk's Office, and must be completed wholly and accurately to be deemed accepted.

4. Issuance of Mercantile License.

Upon submission of the application and required fee to the Borough Clerk, the application shall then be forwarded to the Mercantile License Inspector, the Code Enforcement Officer, the Department of Public Safety and the Zoning Officer of the Borough of West Wildwood for departmental review. If there is no violation of the Borough's Ordinances or any law of the State of New Jersey is noted by any of the reviewing departments, the license shall be issued by the Borough Clerk within ten (10) days of the receipt of the application. If the application is not approved, the applicant shall be advised of the reasons for refusal in writing

by mail within the same ten (10) day period.

5. Appeal from Denial of Mercantile License.

If an application for mercantile license is denied, the applicant may submit an appeal, in writing, within ten (10) days of receipt of the denial. The appeal shall then be considered by the Board of Commissioners at its next, regularly scheduled monthly meeting.

6. Expiration and Renewal of Mercantile License.

All mercantile licenses shall expire on the thirtieth (30th) day of April following their issuance. Applicants shall file their applications for renewal of their mercantile license on or before the thirtieth (30th) of April of each calendar year. The renewal fee is the same as those provided in Schedule A attached to this Ordinance. The provisions of this Section, however, shall not apply to any person acting pursuant to an order or process of a Court of competent jurisdiction, or any person acting in accordance with their powers and duties as public officials.

7. Fees.

Schedule A of this Ordinance contains the fees to be submitted with each initial or renewal mercantile license application. Column A applies to those applications received before or on the thirtieth (30th) of April of each calendar year, and Column B applies to those received after.

8. Inspections.

The mercantile licensee shall permit all reasonable inspections of his business and shall permit access to the licensed premises or vehicle at all reasonable times for the purpose of inspection. The application for a mercantile license shall be deemed as a consent by the applicant to an inspection of the property upon which the licensed activity is conducted, for the sole purpose of determining whether the subject property complies with all applicable codes of the Borough of West Wildwood and/or the State of New Jersey relating to the physical condition and maintenance of properties. No mercantile license will be issued or renewed for any applicant where the premises upon which the licensed activity is to be conducted does not comply with all of the applicable resolutions, ordinances, codes, statutes, rules and regulations of the Borough of West Wildwood or the

State of New Jersey.

9. Display of License.

- a. Fixed Location. Where the licensed activity is conducted at a fixed location, the license shall be prominently displayed on the licensed premises at a location near the primary entrance, in such a manner that it will be visible to people who enter the premises.
- b. Vehicles. Each vehicle licensed under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be assigned a number by the Borough Clerk, which must be displayed upon the licensed vehicle at all times, on the dashboard to the right of the driver.
- c. Other. In all other cases, the licensee shall have the license in his possession at all times, and must wear a badge containing the following information:
  - i. a photograph of the licensee;
  - ii. the name of the licensee; and
  - iii. the business conducted by the licensee.

10. Posting of Prices.

All businesses that have been licensed and have paid a fee pursuant to this Ordinance must post their prices for the goods or services that are to be sold to the public.

11. Amplification Systems.

No amplification system shall be permitted to operate out-of-doors for any business in the Borough of West Wildwood. Where a business maintains an amplification system, such system must be at least ten (10') feet from any door leading to the outside of the structure where that business is maintained.

12. Transaction of Other Business; Ancillary Uses.

The licensee may not permit or transact any business other than that which has been licensed on the premises. Uses that are not specifically permitted or ancillary must have Planning or Zoning Board approval and require the issuance of a separate mercantile license prior to operation. For purposes of this Ordinance, pinball machines, video games, and other like activities are only to be maintained in business that are licensed and zoned for same. If any business has

more than two (2) games of this nature located on the premises, this shall be considered a primary use, and the business must therefore secure a license for same and comply with all statutes, ordinances and zoning regulations relating to their operation.

### 13. Compliance with Other Laws and Ordinances.

No licenses shall be issued to any person who has not complied with the laws of the State of New Jersey or the Ordinances of the Borough of West Wildwood, providing regulations respecting the safety and health of those persons who may have occasion to use the premises, place or thing licensed, and in the event any licensed person fails to comply with such laws or ordinances after due notice and opportunity to be heard, the Board of Commissioners may revoke such license.

### 14. Barking or Calling.

No person licensed under this Ordinance may engage in the practice commonly known as "barking or ballyhooing" or otherwise using any sound making device of any nature, including the human voice, for the purpose of attracting the attention or soliciting the patronage of persons passing the location at which he is conducting business.

### 15. Pullers-In.

No person licensed under this Ordinance or any person acting for him directly or indirectly, shall solicit or attempt to solicit anyone to enter any place where a business activity is being conducted by engaging in conversation with or accosting passerby for the purpose of urging them to enter the premises where the business is being conducted.

### 16. Conduct of Business Transactions.

All licensees must conduct their business transactions within the licensed premises. If a licensee provides window service, counter service, or similar service, there shall be an area for patrons to stand, which window area or counter service area shall be located a minimum of six (6) feet from the public right of way.

### 17. Code Enforcement Officer Approval.

Any license issued under this section may be revoked without refund if the

exterior paint scheme to be utilized on the licensed premises, the exterior signs to be utilized on the licensed premises, or signs visible from the exterior of the licenses premises fail to meet with the approval of the Code Enforcement Officer of the Borough. This approval shall not be withheld unless the design and/or paint scheme are likely, in the opinion of the Officer, to create pedestrian and/or traffic congestion. In the event that such paint scheme or signs fail to meet with the approval of the Official, due notice to that effect shall be immediately served upon the persons issued such license and an opportunity to be heard before the Board of Commissioners shall be provided to the person licensed prior to the removal of their mercantile license.

#### 18. Dance Halls and Coffee Houses.

Due to the Borough's determination that a large and unlimited number of dance halls and coffee houses within West Wildwood would constitute a source of disruption, annoyance and nuisance along with a level of detriment to the health, comfort and safety of those residents and visitors of the Borough, the number of dance halls to be licensed is limited to three (3) and the number of coffee houses is limited to three (3) as well. These limited numbers are deemed adequate to meet the needs of the population of the Borough, while maintaining the desired levels of health, comfort and safety.

#### 19. Revocation of License.

Failure to adhere to the above regulations and requirements shall constitute grounds for the revocation of a mercantile license. Applicants shall not be entitled to a refund of mercantile license fees if their mercantile license is revoked for a violation of any of the terms of this Ordinance.

### SECTION VIII. Peddling and Soliciting.

1. Definitions. For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following words shall have the following meanings:

- a. Peddler: a person who goes from house-to-house, or from place-to-place, whether on foot or in a vehicle, selling and delivering goods and services.

- b. Solicitor: a person who goes from house-to-house selling or buying goods, wares or merchandise by sample, or by taking orders for future delivery, or selling a service to be rendered in the future. The provisions of this section shall apply to the person who comes in personal contact with the buyer whether he obtains the order, delivers the goods, or accepts money in payment for them. "Solicitor" shall also mean any person who goes from house-to-house or from place-to-place for the purpose of obtaining alms, contributions or subscriptions, or who does research analysis, makes surveys or opinion polls, obtains rating data or similar information, or who engages in any similar work which involves a door-to-door or place-to-place activity.
- c. Non-Profit Organization: a group of persons, corporation, or association organized for philanthropic, charitable, religious, patriotic, or other public service purposes, not for private gain. Examples of non-profit organizations include volunteer fire departments and first aid squads, veterans groups and organizations which assist the poor, the aged, the sick, the physically or mentally handicapped, or which aid victims of flood, fire, or catastrophe. This enumeration is intended to be typical, and is not to be construed as exclusive.

## 2. License Required.

Any person peddling or soliciting within the Borough of West Wildwood, either directly or indirectly, must first obtain a mercantile license, except in those cases where a different license is required by any provision of this Ordinance, any other Ordinance of the Borough of West Wildwood, or any statute of the State of New Jersey.

## 3. Exceptions to License Requirement.

The following persons or groups do not need to obtain a mercantile license from the Borough of West Wildwood to engage in peddling or soliciting activities:

- a. any person licensed by the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance or the Real Estate Commission of the State of New Jersey;
- b. persons selling personal property at wholesale to dealers in such articles;
- c. any sale required by statute or order of any court;

- d. any person engaged in delivering merchandise or other things in the regular course of business to the premises of a person ordering or entitled
- e. to receive it;

- f. any person soliciting votes for a bona fide candidate for political office.

#### 4. Special Provisions for Certain Persons.

- a. Veterans who hold a special state license under the laws of the State of New Jersey, persons to whom a valid mercantile license has been issued under the provisions of laws or ordinances other than this section, and person selling products grown on their own farms shall not be required to apply for or secure a license to pay any fee, but shall comply with all other applicable provisions of this revision and shall be required to possess a special permit which shall be issued by the Borough Clerk upon presentation of the proper identification as proof of their status.

- b. Religious organizations shall not be required to pay any fees, but shall otherwise comply with all other applicable provisions of this Ordinance, including, but not limited to, the procedure for applications set forth in this Ordinance and the requirements to possess and display an identification badge approved by the Borough Clerk.

#### 5. Non-Profit Organizations

- a. Non-profit organizations as defined by the Internal Revenue Service, desiring to engage in any of the activities for which a license is required by this Ordinance, must pay an application fee of fifty (\$50.00) dollars, which may be waived at the discretion of the Commissioners, cooperate with the rest of the requirements of this Ordinance, and submit a sworn statement containing the following information:
  - i. the name and purpose of the organization for which the permit is sought;
  - ii. the names and addresses of the officers of the organization;
  - iii. the names and addresses of agents or representatives of the organization who will solicit, sell merchandise, or distribute literature within the Borough.



b. The number of members of the soliciting group shall be limited to eight (8), with a maximum of four (4) soliciting within the Borough at any one time.

The members working at a given time shall work in teams with a maximum of two (2) members per team, and those teams shall not work within four (4) blocks of any other team. The hours within which the members may solicit, sell merchandise, or distribute literature within the Borough is limited to between 11:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. daily.

6. Application for License.

Applications for a mercantile license must be made in accordance with Section VII-3 of this Ordinance, with the only exception being the difference in price. In addition to those requirements, anyone applying to peddle or solicit within the Borough of West Wildwood must also submit the following information, along with their application:

- a. if the applicant is employed by another, the name and address of his employer, together with the credentials establishing that relationship;
- b. the days of the week and the hours of the day during which the licensed activity will be conducted;
- c. a description of the nature of the business and the goods, property or services to be sold or supplied;
- d. a statement as to the location or source of supply of any merchandise to be offered for sale and the method of delivery;
- e. a statement as to whether the applicant has been convicted of any crime or the violation of any municipal ordinance other than traffic offenses, and, if any, the date and place of the conviction, the nature of the offense, and the punishment or penalty imposed;
- f. the applicant shall be fingerprinted if the Department of Public Safety determines that fingerprints are necessary for proper identification. Fingerprint records shall be immediately processed for classification and identification;
- g. three (3) recent photographs of the applicant, approximately two inches by

- three inches (2" x 3"), showing the head and shoulders of the applicant in a clear and distinguishing manner;
  - h. the specific time and place where the applicant intends to peddle or solicit;
  - i. each representative or agent of the organization shall wear a badge to be approved by the Borough Clerk;
  - j. each soliciting member of the organization shall, on a daily basis, report to the Borough Police Department prior to commencing solicitation or peddling and shall check out at the same location when terminating for the day the member shall sign in and designate the location and the term to be worked on that particular day;
  - k. when soliciting, members of the organization must adhere to all State regulations and Municipal ordinances, in addition to the following:
    - i. there shall be no chanting, music, barking, or other attention getting activity;
    - ii. in no event shall there be any activity which will result in a gathering of a group of people which might obstruct traffic or in any other way create a disturbance;
  - l. if the applicant is a non-profit organization, the applicant shall provide proof of their non-profit status to the Borough Clerk's satisfaction.
7. Investigation of Applicants.

Each application shall be referred to the Department of Public Safety, which will immediately determine and institute whatever investigation of the applicant's business and moral character is deemed necessary for the protection of the public. In addition, in the event an applicant requests status as a non-profit organization, the Department of Public Safety shall conduct whatever inquiry he considers necessary to determine that the organization in question is a bona fide non-profit organization. He shall communicate his findings, in writing together with a recommendation that the application be granted or denied, to the Board of Commissioners within ten (10) days of the application being filed. The Board of Commissioners shall consider the application at their next regular meeting after receiving the report of the investigation.

If, based upon the information contained in the application and the report, the Board of Commissioners decides that the applicant's character, ability or business responsibility is unsatisfactory, or that the products, services or activity are not free from fraud, the Board of Commissioners shall disapprove the application and refuse to issue the license and so notify the applicant. Otherwise, the Board of Commissioners shall approve the application and the Borough Clerk shall issue the license immediately to the applicant, provided that the required license fees have been paid.

8. Expiration Date; Renewal; License Fee.

The expiration date, renewal procedure, and license fees are all the same as those provided in Section VII. of this Ordinance.

9. Conduct of Licensees.

Every person licensed under this section shall conduct himself according to the following rules and regulations:

- a. he shall not enter or attempt to enter the house of any resident of the Borough without an express invitation from the occupant of the house;
- b. he shall not conduct himself in a manner that is objectionable or annoying to the occupant of any house;
- c. no licensee or person acting on his behalf shall shout, blow a horn, ring a bell, or use any other sound making or amplifying device on any street, park or other public place, or on any private premises so that sounds are produced which can be plainly heard on streets, avenues, parks or other public places for the purpose of attracting attention to the licensee or to the activities carried on by him;
- d. in general, all licensees and any vehicles used by them in the course of the licensed activity shall fully comply with all of the provisions of this Ordinance or other applicable municipal ordinances, and all applicable state laws or regulations, particularly those which deal with the protection of public health, safety and welfare.

10. Use of Vehicles; Location Restriction.

- a. No licensee shall transact business from his vehicle unless it is properly

parked immediately adjacent to the curb of a public street in a permitted locality.

b. No licensee shall at any time double park his vehicle while transacting business, nor transact business other than on the curb at the side of his vehicle.

c. No licensee shall have an exclusive right to any location in the public streets nor shall he be permitted a stationary location on the streets or be permitted to operate in a congested area where his operations may impede the free flow of pedestrian and vehicular traffic. For the purpose of this subsection, the judgment of a police officer, if reasonable and made in good faith, shall be conclusive as to whether the area is congested or traffic impeded or inconvenienced.

d. The number of licenses issued under this section to vehicles vending food products at retail prices shall be limited to a maximum of three (3), which number is deemed sufficient to meet the public need and prevent the creation of a hazard and nuisance on the public streets. No license hereunder shall be issued unless the Commissioners of the Borough shall first be satisfied that public convenience and necessity so require.

i. For the purpose of this section, food products shall be defined to mean ice cream, ice cream products, and beverages.

ii. The distribution of food products from vehicles other than those permitted in paragraph i, above, or otherwise permitted by state law to be distributed from vehicles is prohibited.

#### 11. Non-Transferability.

Licenses issued under the provisions of this section shall not be transferrable.

### SECTION IX. Beach Peddler's License.

#### 1. License Required; Limitation.

No person shall peddle any ice cream, food, beverages, confections or merchandise of any description on the public beaches along the bay front of the Borough without having first obtained a license as provided in this Ordinance.

The number of licenses to be issued by the Borough Clerk for this purpose is to be limited to three (3).

2. Application for License.

Applications for a mercantile license must be made in accordance with Section VII-3 of this Ordinance. In addition to those requirements, anyone applying to peddle on the beaches of West Wildwood must produce evidence of a current peddler's license issued by the County Clerk of the State of New Jersey in accordance with

N.J.R.S. 45:24-9 et seq.

3. Issuance of License.

The investigation of the applicant, report from the Department of Public Safety and consideration of the application by the Board of Commissioners shall be in accordance with procedure established in Section VIII-7 of this Ordinance. No license shall be issued to anyone who is not the holder of a valid, subsisting peddler's license issued by a County Clerk of the State of New Jersey pursuant to N.J.R.S. 45:24-9, et seq.

Licenses shall be issued to persons who have submitted applications to the Borough Clerk on or before April 30th of each year, on a first-come-first-serve basis, subject to the provisions of Section VII.

4. Expiration Date; Renewal; License Fee.

The expiration date, renewal procedure, and license fees are all the same as those provided in Section VII. of this Ordinance.

5. Additional Regulations.

In addition to those regulations provided in Sections VII and VIII of this Ordinance, every person licensed under this section must also:

- a. prominently display on the container or carrier of his product the price to be charged for the product, and he shall not charge more than the price displayed;
- b. wear clean, white, outer garments;
- c. have available for inspection at any time by the Division of Health his clothing and equipment, which must comply with all provisions of the Division of Health and any other Borough Ordinances;
- d. the storage place and distribution points for ice cream, foods, beverages,

- confections and related commodities sold by peddlers licensed under this section shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition and shall be subject to inspection by the Division of Health, and shall fully comply with the ordinances of the Borough of West Wildwood and the laws of the State of New Jersey, along with any and all rules and regulations of the Division of Health;
- e. no licensee shall conduct business within fifty (50') feet of any regularly established beach grille;
  - f. each licensee must maintain non-cancelable liability insurance in the amount of \$50,000.00/\$100,000.00, with the Borough of West Wildwood named as an additional insured.

#### **SECTION X. Auctions.**

##### **1. No Licenses to be Issued.**

There shall be no licenses issued to carry on the business of auctions, auction sales, auction houses, or jam joints.

#### **SECTION XI. Miniature Golf Courses.**

##### **1. Definitions.**

For the purpose of this Ordinance the following words shall have the following meanings:

- a. Indoor Course: any miniature golf course erected or constructed completely within the walls of any approved building designed for permanent use and occupancy.
  - b. Outdoor Course: any miniature golf course other than an indoor course as defined in paragraph a. above.
- ##### **2. License Required.**

Any person operating a miniature golf course within the Borough of West Wildwood, either directly or indirectly, must first obtain a mercantile license to do so.

##### **3. Application.**

Application for a license to operate a miniature golf course shall be made to the

Borough Clerk, upon the forms provided by the Borough Clerk, and shall contain the following information:

- a. the name and address of the applicant if the applicant is a corporation, its name, the address of its personal place of business, and the name and address of its registered agent;
  - b. the street address or location of the miniature golf course sought to be licensed; and
  - c. such other information as the Clerk may deem appropriate and necessary.
4. Expiration Date; Renewal; License Fee.

The expiration date, renewal procedure, and license fees are all the same as those provided in Section VII of this Ordinance.

5. Regulations.
- a. All miniature golf courses shall be conducted in a quiet and orderly manner.
  - b. No miniature golf course may be open for play, nor shall any play occur, between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.
  - c. The lighting system installed on any outdoor miniature golf course shall be designed and arranged so that the rays from the lamps or reflectors forming part of the lighting system do not interfere with the comfort and privacy of the occupants of adjoining premises or public thoroughfares.
  - d. No licensee or employee shall permit the premises or its appurtenances to become unsanitary, and adequate receptacles must be provided for the disposal of refuse.
  - e. No licensee or employee shall permit any vocal or instrumental music or any other sound by means of any mechanical device of any kind to be made for the purpose of attracting or entertaining patrons except between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.

## SECTION XII. Taxicabs.

### 1. Definitions.

For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following words shall have the following meanings:

- a. Taxicab or Taxi: a motor vehicle used to transport passengers for hire which does not operate over a fixed route, is not hired by the day or hour, and does not carry more than seven (7) passengers at a time as follows:
  - i. no more than three (3) passengers to occupy each rear seat in the vehicle;
  - ii. no more than one (1) passenger other than the driver in the front seat of the vehicle.
  - iii. no license shall be issued to a vehicle other than a standard passenger car or a standard passenger station wagon.

- b. Owner: any person in whose name title to any taxicab is registered with the New Jersey Department of Motor Vehicles, or who appears in the department's records as a conditional vendee or lessee, or has any other proprietary interest in a taxicab.

- c. Operation: transporting in a taxicab one or more persons for hire – accepting a passenger to be transported for hire from a point of departure within the Borough of West Wildwood to a destination within or without the Borough shall be considered operation of a taxicab within the Borough. The operation of a taxicab by one other than the owner shall be deemed operation by the owner as well as by the person actually driving the taxi. The transportation of any person other than the owner or driver in any motor vehicle bearing the words "taxi," "taxicab," "cab," or "hack" shall be presumed, in the absence of evidence to the contrary, to be the operation of a taxicab.

## 2. License Required.

Any person operating a taxicab within the Borough of West Wildwood, either directly or indirectly, must first obtain a mercantile license to do so.

## 3. Expiration Date; Renewal; License Fee.

The expiration date, renewal procedure, and license fees are all the same as those provided in Section VII of this Ordinance.

## 4. Number of Taxicabs.

The number of taxicabs licensed to operate within the Borough shall not exceed ten (10), which is determined to be the maximum number which may be permitted to operate without creating undue congestion on the streets of the Borough, including congestion in the vicinity of places at which taxicabs



frequently pick up or discharge passengers. No license hereunder shall be issued unless the Commissioners are satisfied that public convenience and necessity so require.

5. Qualifications and Owner's Mercantile License.

An applicant for a taxicab owner's mercantile license shall be at least eighteen (18) years of age, and shall possess a New Jersey driver's license.

6. Application Information.

Application for a taxicab mercantile license shall be made to the Department of Public Safety and the Borough Clerk, and shall include:

- a. the full name and address of the applicant, along with his date of birth and social security number;
- b. information regarding whether the applicant has been convicted of a crime, and, if so, the crime of which he has been convicted, the date of conviction, and where it occurred;
- c. driver's license number, along with evidence that the license is not now, nor has it ever been revoked;
- d. consent to a criminal history investigation by the Department of Public Safety, in order to secure reports from any agency it may deem desirable or necessary with respect to the mercantile application
- e. three photographs, approximately one and one half by one and one half (1 ½" x 1 ½") inches, clearly depicting the facial features of the applicant and not having been taken more than thirty (30) days prior to the date of application, each of which shall become the property of the Borough and shall be retained with the application form unless the application shall be granted and the license issued, whereby one photograph must be permanently affixed to the license card issued to the taxicab driver, with one photograph remaining with the Borough Clerk and one being delivered to the Department of Public Safety;
- f. a non-refundable fifteen (\$15.00) dollar application fee;
- g. if the applicant is a corporation, the application must set forth the names and addresses of the officers, directors, or stockholders, and must also state whether or not the officers, directors, or stockholders have been convicted of a crime. If an officer, director, or stockholder has been convicted of a crime,

the application must also include information regarding for what crime he was convicted, the place of the crime, and the date thereof;

- h. if the applicant is an individual or co-partnership, said application shall state whether or not the applicant has been convicted of a crime, and, if so, the crime committed, place of conviction, and date thereof;
- i. a description of the taxicab sought to be licensed, including the type of motor vehicle, the name of the manufacturer, serial number, license number and seating capacity; and
- j. such other information as the Board of Commissioners may appropriately, by resolution, require.

#### 7. Insurance.

All taxicabs licensed under this Ordinance must have and exhibit to the Borough Clerk a general liability insurance policy with limits of not less than one hundred thousand (\$100,000.00) dollars in the event of bodily injury or death to a person, and not less than three hundred thousand (\$300,000.00) dollars in the event of bodily injury or death to any number of persons, in any one accident, and with limits of not less than fifty thousand (\$50,000.00) dollars for property damage.

#### 8. Issuance of license.

The Board of Commissioners, within ten (10) days of the filing of the application, will either grant or deny the license. Applications shall be considered in the order in which they are received.

#### 9. Transferability.

- a. No taxicab owner's license shall be transferred without the approval of the Board of Commissioners and the payment of the fee for a taxicab license as set forth above. No such approval shall be granted to any person who is not qualified by the provisions of this section to obtain a taxicab license.
- b. A licensee may be permitted to substitute a driver or vehicle in the place of a licensed driver or vehicle provided that notice of the proposed substitution is given to the Borough Clerk, which notice shall contain information as is required in the original registration of a driver or vehicle.
  - i. in the event that permission is sought to substitute a driver because of

damage or destruction of the vehicle, or injury or illness of the driver, temporary permission for the substitution may be made by the Department of Public Safety.

- ii. Temporary permission as provided in subsection i. may only be for a period up to seventy-two (72) hours.

#### 10. Registration of Drivers.

All taxicab owners and drivers must register with the Borough Clerk and complete such registration forms and questionnaires as may be appropriately required. Registrants shall be fingerprinted and photographed to permit the proper identification of the registrant. The fee for registration shall be as set forth above. Registration shall be evidenced by a registration certificate, which must be displayed in the taxicab at all times while the registrant is operating same.

#### 11. Rates.

The maximum rates to be charged by any licensed taxicab shall be those set forth in a "Taxicab Rate Schedule," to be adopted and amended from time to time by resolution of the Borough of West Wildwood and filed with the Borough Clerk.

- a. The initial "Taxicab Rate Schedule" shall be as follows:
  - i. Six (\$6.00) dollars for one (1) city block (or any portion thereof) through twenty-four (24) city blocks (or any portion thereof) for one (1) person.
  - ii. Seven (\$7.00) dollars for any trip more than twenty-four (24) city blocks through thirty (30) city blocks (or any portion thereof) for one (1) person.
  - iii. For any trip of more than thirty (30) city blocks, seven (\$7.00) dollars, plus an additional charge of one (\$1.00) dollar for each additional five (5) city blocks (or any portion thereof).
  - iv. For each additional person, the maximum fare to be charged may increase by one (\$1.00) dollar per person.
  - v. Two dollars and fifty (\$2.50) cents per five (5) minutes (or any portion thereof) of waiting time.
  - vi. All fares not encompassed by the preceding subsections shall be negotiated and settled upon by the taxicab driver and the prospective

passenger(s) prior to the commencement of the trip.

- b. Every taxicab licensed under this Ordinance must have these rates permanently and prominently displayed, plainly visible for its passengers.
- c. The operator of every taxicab shall, at all times, have available a suitable cash receipt book to write out, sign, and give to any passenger requesting a written receipt in the amount of the fare paid.

#### 12. Identification of Taxicab.

If the application for a taxicab driver's license shall be granted, there shall be issued to the applicant a license card setting forth the number of the license, the name and address of the licensee, and his or her age. Said license card shall be signed by the Borough Clerk and shall at all times be permanently displayed and adequately protected in the interior of any taxicab operated by the licensee, so that the face thereof shall at all times be in full view of and plainly legible to any person seated in the rear seat of such taxicab.

#### 13. Regulations.

Every taxicab licensed under this section shall be operated in accordance with the following regulations:

- a. Misrepresentation. No driver of a taxicab shall induce any person to employ him by knowingly misinforming that person as to the time or place of the arrival or departure of any train or bus or as to the location of any public place or private residence within the Borough, or as to the distance between any two points. Nor shall any driver convey a passenger to any other place or over any other route than that which the passenger may have instructed him to take. Unless otherwise requested, passengers shall be conveyed only over the most direct, practical routes to their destination.
- b. New Rules. There is reserved to the Commissioners the right to make such rules and regulations in relation to the operation of taxicabs and the conduct of the operators thereof as the Commissioners may determine to be necessary and proper in the best interests of the citizens of the Borough.

#### 14. Suspensions and Revocation of Licenses or Certificates.

- a. Licenses or certificates may be suspended temporarily or permanently revoked by the Commissioner of Public Safety at any

time, if:

- i. the owner shall cease to operate any taxicab or taxicabs for the period of one (1) year without first having obtained permission for cessation of operation from the Commissioner of Public Safety;
  - ii. the taxicab is operated at a rate of fare other than that prescribed in the Taxicab Rate Schedule, or any amendment thereof;
  - iii. if at any time within the licensed year a taxicab owner or driver has been convicted of a crime, the Board of Commissioners shall immediately suspend or revoke the owner's or driver's mercantile license; or
  - iv. for failing to comply with the provisions of this section, state laws, or the traffic rules or regulations of the Borough of West Wildwood Police Department now existing or hereafter adopted.
- b. For failing to comply with any of the above, the license may be suspended or revoked by the Borough upon due notice and hearing by the Commissioner of Public Safety or his designee, in addition to any fines or penalties which may be imposed in the Borough's Municipal Court.
  - c. Suspension or revocation shall be in writing and any aggrieved party may have the same right of appeal to the Commissioners. Any owner or operator shall immediately cease operation upon receipt of a written notice, and not resume operation until the license or certificate is restored or the suspension expires.
  - d. Owner's liability. Any violation of this section by any driver shall constitute a similar violation on the part of the owner of the taxicab.

### **SECTION XIII. Bingo Licensing.**

1. The Borough hereby adopts all benefits, rights and privileges as contained in the Bingo Licensing Law, as provided in R.S. 5:8-24, et seq.
2. It shall be lawful to conduct such games of chance on any day of the week, provided the license issued by the Borough so provides.
3. The penalty for the violation of the Bingo Licensing Law shall be as provided for by R.S. 5:8-41.

## **SECTION XIV. Rental of Rooms, Dwellings, Apartments, and Multiple Dwellings.**

### **1. Definitions.**

For the purpose of this Ordinance the following words shall have the following meanings:

- a. **Apartment or Dwelling:** any apartment, cottage, bungalow, or other dwelling place consisting of a room or suite of rooms designed, with or without housekeeping facilities, for dwelling purposes, regardless of whether or not the same occupy one or more floors and regardless of whether the same occupy an entire building or only a part thereof.
  - b. **Sleep Accommodations:** the number of individuals who may be in the beds located in any one apartment or dwelling, counting a standard bed as proper accommodation for one individual and counting a standard double bed as proper accommodations for two individuals.
- 2. License Required.**

Any person renting an apartment or dwelling within the Borough of West Wildwood, either directly or indirectly, must first obtain a mercantile license to do so.

**3. Expiration Date; Renewal; License Fees.**

The expiration date, renewal procedure, and license fees are all the same as those provided in Section VII of this Ordinance.

**4. Additional Requirements.**

In addition to the provisions contained herein, applicants for mercantile licenses for the renting of rooms, dwellings, apartments and efficiencies must comply with the provisions of all other ordinances, codes, statutes, rules and regulations of the Borough of West Wildwood and the State of New Jersey.

**5. Production of Lease.**

It shall be the responsibility of the owner and/or real estate agency to provide a copy of the lease to the Borough of West Wildwood prior to the occupancy of the rental apartment or dwelling when the term is to exceed one hundred twenty (120) days.

## **SECTION XV. Marinas.**

**1. Definition.**

For purposes of this Ordinance, the term "marina" shall mean a facility devoted to the purpose of providing docks, berths, slips or tie-ups for boats and small pleasure crafts, and of providing ancillary services for these boats and crafts.

2. License Required.

Any person operating a marina within the Borough of West Wildwood, either directly or indirectly, must first obtain a mercantile license to do so.

3. Expiration Date; Renewal; License Fees.

The expiration date, renewal procedure, and license fees are all the same as those provided in Section VII of this Ordinance.

4. Ancillary Uses.

In connection with the operation of a Marina, ancillary uses and services including, but not limited to, repair facilities for boats and motors, showrooms for the sale of boats and recreational water vehicles, retail stores selling boating supplies, general merchandise, bait, food and beverages shall be permitted, upon compliance with proper zoning, and the fee for such uses shall be included in the base fee required for marinas under this Ordinance.

5. Additional Uses.

Additional uses of the marina include, but are not necessary limited to, restaurants, rental of boats and recreational water craft, boat slip rentals, fuel pumps, vending machines, and, if permitted, sleeping accommodations, shall be the subject of additional fees as provided under this Ordinance.

**SECTION XVI. Violations and Penalties Enforcement.**

1. Penalties.

For the violation of any provision of this Ordinance, the maximum penalty, upon conviction of the violation, shall be a fine not to exceed five hundred (\$500.00) dollars or imprisonment in the County Jail for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, or both. Each day of continued operation after service of a notice of violation upon the applicant shall be considered a separate offense, allowing the imposition of additional and

separate fines and penalties. In addition thereto, upon such conviction, the person firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to suspension or revocation of the license issued.

**2. Enforcement**

In addition to the other law enforcement agencies of the Borough of West Wildwood, the Health or Medical Officer, the Mercantile License Inspector, the Code Enforcement Officer, or their authorized agents, are hereby empowered to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance and to make complaints and cause arrests for the violation of any of the terms and provisions hereof.

**SECTION XVII. Severability.** If for any reason any section of this Ordinance shall be declared illegal by any Court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining section of the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect, notwithstanding.

**SECTION XVIII. Repealer.** Any Ordinance or provision thereof inconsistent with this Ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

**SECTION XIX. Publication.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon the adoption and publication accordance with the law.



ASSEMBLY BILL A3358 REGARDING CLASS I RENEWABLE ENERGY  
CERTIFICATE MULTIPLIER PROGRAM FOR UNPROFITABLE  
LANDFILL GAS TO ELECTRICITY FACILITIES**

**WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Legislature is currently considering the passage of Senate Bill 2076 ("S2076") and Assembly Bill 3358 ("A3358") which would establish a Class I renewable energy certificate ("REC") multiplier program for only certain electric production facilities in New Jersey fueled by methane extracted from landfills to allow these facilities to offset economic losses; and

**WHEREAS**, some public entities in New Jersey have contracted with private sector companies to design, build, operate and, in some cases, own such landfill gas to electric facilities; and

**WHEREAS**, such privately designed, operated and/or owned landfill gas to electricity facilities decided to reduce their initial capital investment by not installing scrubber systems to remove siloxane and other compounds from landfill gas used to produce electricity; and

**WHEREAS**, such private facilities are now experiencing extensive maintenance costs due to engine damage caused by siloxane and other compounds; and

**WHEREAS**, other landfill gas to electricity facilities in New Jersey that are publicly owned and operated have made prudent capital investments and properly designed such facilities by installing sophisticated scrubber systems to remove siloxane and other equipment damaging compounds from landfill gas to minimize maintenance expenses, improve long-term reliable electric production and improve profitability; and

**WHEREAS**, privately designed, operated and/or owned landfill gas to electricity facilities took and unwarranted risk by not investing in appropriate landfill gas scrubbing technologies and/or adequate maintenance and are now seeking a financial bailout through the passage of S2076/A3358; and

**WHEREAS**, the passage of S2076/A3358 would likely create a glut of Class I REC's thereby decreasing their unit value and effectively penalizing those publicly owned and operated landfill gas to electricity facilities which acted responsibly and made prudent investments in scrubbing technology to ensure the operational and financial success of their facilities; and



**WHEREAS**, the passage of S2076/A3358 would likely increase electric costs for taxpayers in the State of New Jersey in order to fund this private sector bailout and would result in undeserved profits for certain private companies;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of West Wildwood, County of Cape May, New Jersey opposes the passage of S2076/A3358 as it is not in the best public interest; and
