WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-4 requires the governing body of every local unit to have made an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions; and

WHEREAS, the Annual Report of Audit for the year 2015 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Municipal Clerk pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, R.S. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall by resolution, certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "Findings and Recommendations and Questioned Costs"; and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed as a minimum the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "Findings and Questioned Costs" or "Findings and Recommendations", as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the governing body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and


WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52 - to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52 - A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars

(\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his/her office."

1. Final as-built quantity adjustments.

WHEREAS, said Change Order will result in a decrease of \$45,457.39 to the previous contract amount of \$409,821.43. The amended contract amount will be \$364,364.04.

WHEREAS, the combination of all three change orders yielded an overall decrease of \$37,971.89 or -9.44% of the original contract amount.

**A RESOLUTION OPPOSING SEISMIC AIR-GUN TESTING
OFF THE COAST OF NEW JERSEY**

WHEREAS, the proposed seismic air gun blasting utilized to search for oil and gas reserves deep beneath the sea floor; and

WHEREAS, such blasting is proposed for the East Coast; and

WHEREAS, the seismic air use extremely loud blasts of air, 100,000 times more intense than a jet engine and repeated every 10 seconds, 24 hours a day for days to months on end; and

WHEREAS, the blasting can cause permanent hearing loss, injury and even death to whales, dolphins and larval fish when used at shore distances; and

WHEREAS, the air gun noise has been shown to decrease the catch rates within certain fisheries; and

WHEREAS, the commercial and recreation fishing in New Jersey supports over 63,000 jobs, all of which would be threatened by seismic blasting and the offshore drilling that would follow; AND

WHEREAS, the Ocean-based tourism and recreation generates nearly 3.1 billion in GDP (Gross Domestic Profit) for the state and sustains over 79,000 jobs; and


WHEREAS, the Obama Administration could decide in the next weeks to allow companies to use seismic air guns to search for oil and gas deposits in the Atlantic Ocean within the next few weeks; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of West Wildwood Mayor and Commissioners urge Governor Christie to oppose the seismic air gun blasting off the coast of New Jersey.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Interior has included the Atlantic Ocean in its Outer Continental Shelf (OCS) Oil and Gas Leasing Draft Proposed Program for 2017-2022; and

WHEREAS, this proposed draft allows for oil and gas exploration in a portion of the Mid- and South Atlantic planning areas offshore Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia; and

WHEREAS, due to the current flow and natural movement of ocean waters, an oil spill in the Atlantic Ocean would not occur in isolation and would cause catastrophic damage to a fragile and priceless ecosystem; and

WHEREAS, the blasting can cause permanent hearing loss, injury and even death to whales, dolphins and larval fish when used at shore distances; and

WHEREAS, Cape May County is located at the most southern tip of New Jersey and whose economy is driven by beach tourism and aquaculture both of which would be devastated in the event of a drilling disaster; and

WHEREAS, the BP, Deepwater Horizon incident which occurred in the Gulf Region of the United States resulted in catastrophic environmental and economic impacts to that area; and

WHEREAS, offshore drilling poses a substantial risk of economic and environmental devastation to all shoreline communities;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of West Wildwood, County of Cape May, New Jersey, opposes any plan by the United States Department of Interior to allow offshore drilling in the Atlantic Ocean, and

RESOLUTION 2016-084

REQUESTING A GRANDFATHERING PROVISION BE INCLUDED IN
THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE LAWS TO PROTECT
HOMEOWNERS WHO'S HOMES ARE BUILT TO ELEVATIONS
ACCEPTABLE AT THE TIME OF CONSTRUCTION OR RECONSTRUCTION

WHEREAS, Super Storm Sandy struck the State of New Jersey, inflicting unprecedented damage through the State and causing catastrophic flooding and damage to communities across the State, including the Borough of West Wildwood; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the disaster, many homes were substantially damaged, requiring them to be rebuilt; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the disaster, the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") released Base Flood Elevations (BFE) to aid communities in rebuilding; and

WHEREAS, these BFE's have dictated how substantially damaged homes were rebuilt, requiring not only certain building materials and designs, But structural elevations as well through National Flood Insurance Laws; and

WHEREAS, Super Storm Sandy also impacted homes not substantially damaged, placing them in new zones following the adoption of FEMA's maps, which not require them to be a higher elevation and built to a different code; and

WHEREAS, these homeowners, because their homes were not substantially damaged, do not qualify for State and Federal programs to raise their homes to the levels consistent with the BFE's or rebuild to current building standards; and

WHEREAS, by not including a grandfathering provision in the National Flood Insurance Laws, these homeowners are either forced to elevate and remodel, or pay increased flood insurance premiums or will lose value in their homes upon resale as their homes will be valued less by potential buyers who will be forced to elevate them; and

WHEREAS, this results in a reality that is unfair given the inability for these homeowners to qualify for programs to assist them in bringing their home into compliance; and

WHEREAS, the only way to ameliorate this injustice is to insert a grandfathering provision into National Flood Insurance Laws to permit those homes not substantially damaged to be deemed compliant, provided they were appropriately constructed or reconstructed to standards at that time; and

WHEREAS, due to the projected thousands of individuals who will be affected unfairly by these

provisions in flood insurance laws, the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of West Wildwood requests that grandfathering provisions be included in applicable flood insurance laws to protect homeowners whose homes were not substantially impacted by Super Storm Sandy but will be substantially impacted by the requirement of these laws.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of West Wildwood, County of Cape May, New Jersey, as follows:

- 1.) The Board of Commissioners of the borough of West Wildwood requests that a grandfathering provision be included in flood insurance laws to protect homes that were not substantially damaged from the building and elevation requirement of these laws.
- 2.) Copies of this resolution shall be forwarded to the Governor of the State of New Jersey, New Jersey Senate President, New Jersey Assembly Speaker, Commissioner of the Department of Community Affairs, Cape May County Freeholders, Governing Bodies of New Jersey coastal towns and the representatives of the 1st, 3rd, 9th and 10th Legislative Districts
