### Reports from Commissioners:

Mayor Fox gave the Police Activity Report for the month of April 2017 total 623 calls. (copy attached). Comm. Maxwell commended the WWVFC and the office staff for all of their hard work. Maureen Smith, President of the WWVFC Ladies Auxiliary reported that they are holding a hoagie sale fundraiser, cost is \$7.00 for a twelve inch hoagie and a small bag of chips. The Ladies Auxiliary supports the Fire Company through these fundraisers. The will be at the July 4<sup>th</sup>, - family festival and Fire Company meet and greet events. Most recently they donated money to the fire company.

Comm.Golden reported 101 DPW work orders, list is available. Also, the kayak racks should be complete in a couple of weeks. He reminded everyone of the borough wide yard sale and free bulk trash in June.

Prior to opening the meeting to the floor for public comment, the Mayor explained the reasons for the MUA bill increase, due to an excess charge for 2016 and a rate increase by the CMCMUA for 2017. He also informed the public that our tax rate would be increasing by \$ 24.5 cents, due in part to the drop of valuation of properties from the new assessments.

Mayor opened the meeting to floor for public comment.

BILL MARTIN, 737 W. Poplar Avenue, commented that when he walks his dog he has noticed some open sewer pipe caps, and inquired about a smoke test. Two properties are 735W. Poplar Avenue which has holes drilled in the cap, and 532 W. Glenwood Ave. He also asked for an update of the 26<sup>th</sup> Street peninsula. Comm. Golden will check on the properties. Administrator Ridings gave an update for 26<sup>th</sup> St. He noted that we were declined the funding from NOAA last year and that the borough has re-applied again this year for NOAA funding. It is called a living shoreline which consists of geo tubes and rock to capture the soil and re-build itself. Scientists from the Nature Conservatory, along with the Jacque Costeau institute involved, the hope is that if we are shovel ready NOAA will look more favorably upon this project for funding.

<u>LORI PERLOFF</u>, 655 N. Drive, asked what was going on with Neptune Avenue flood gate. Administrator Ridings informed her that it is being worked on by R.A. Walters, and that a bladder is in the pipe. Mayor Fox was not pleased with the slow progress on this project along with the valve at Avenue J.

<u>SUSAN CZALINA</u>, 547 W. Maple Avenue, asked about parking in front of driveways, illegal? Mayor explained that the ordinance was just introduced.

BOB KILGORE, 3 D Avenue, he was misinformed about the school tax.

<u>LORI PERLOFF</u>, 655 North Drive, explained that the school board is allowed to carry so much surplus, they can't turn back all of it to the borough in the event that more children move here, however they did give some money to the borough. Comm. Maxwell met with Bob, Jim and the County School Administrator to discuss funding fluxuations with students. He apologized to Bob Kilgore publically for discussions over this matter. Comm. Maxwell explained as an example if the borough received ninety thousand dollars only half of that amount would be for this year, and the other half would show up in next year's budget, because the school budget ends June 30.

<u>SUSAN CZWALINA</u>, 547 W. Maple Avenue, asked if this would be a school tax decrease. The Mayor was concerned over previous statements that had been made about the amount of surplus as well as how to use any money received by the school board. He stated that it would be used to reduce taxes, not for other things.

<u>PATRICIA McDONOUGH-MITROS</u>, 700 W. Poplar Avenue, explained that her husband suffers from a disease, and she called for assistance for the police to help lift him up, which they had been doing. When she called last week the police came but would not help lift him up, they called for rescue to assist. She wanted to know why the police would no longer help lift her husband up. She asked the public to stand in support of anyone they know who suffers from a disease, be it alcoholism, or substance abuse. The Mayor explained that EMT'S are trained to properly assist with the lifts, not the police. She stated that it costs \$125.00 every time rescue comes out to help because they say it's not an emergency. Comments were made back and forth by audience members. The Mayor stated that he does not want a police officer or a resident to get hurt, it is the responsibility of the rescue squad.

<u>JOE HICKEY</u>, 718 W. Pine Avenue, questioned who the people were who performed the revaluation, stating that the person who he talked to was a realtor. He lost \$140, 000 in assessment. The clerk explained the criteria for the revaluation company who was recommended by the assessor.

<u>NANCY MARINO</u>, 215 R Avenue, complained about the road reconstruction project, stating that she can't get into her driveway, her lawn which was already graded upwards now has to be raised, it will cost \$20,000, is the borough going to help. It (the road work) didn't need to be done. She continued stating

that water will be laying on her property, there will be mosquitos. Mayor Fox explained that this work did need to be done and that the borough can't pay to fix driveways, he did his driveway. The borough did this, not to hurt residents, but for the health and welfare of the entire community. Most people can put in a little dirt and plant grass seed. Comm. Golden stated that this is not the first street to be raised in the borough.

<u>MIKE DZWONIAREK</u>, 205 R Avenue, asked if rain water would go down at high tide. Both Mayor Fox and Commissioner Golden said that drainage should improve.

# ORDINANCE NO. 558 (2017) AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 528 (2013) PERTAINING TO THE RATES FOR SEWER SERVICE

### Preamble:

This Ordinance is to reset the sewer rates for 2017 based on the projected CY2017 Budget needs and allocations.

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Governing Body of the Borough of West Wildwood, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey; as follows:

### **SECTION I**

**Retroactive to January 1, 2017,** the sewer rates for the Borough of West Wildwood are hereby amended to reflect the amounts as follows:

5/8 "Meter	\$ 750.00 per year per unit
3/4 " Meter	\$ 933.00 per year per unit
Bars/Restaurants and other food-sit down service	\$1,200.00 per year
Marinas	\$ 750.00 per year

### SECTION II.

All other Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistencies, are hereby repealed. Should any section, subsection, clause, or portion of this Ordinance be adjudged by a Court of competent jurisdiction as invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance; and

# SECTION III:

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication as required by Law.

# **ORDINANCE 559(2017)**

# AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A DRAINAGE EASEMENT AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, C. Lynn, LLC is the owner in fee of certain property identified on the Tax Map of the Borough of West Wildwood ("Municipality") as Block 100.3 Lots 3.02, in the County of Cape May, State of New Jersey (the property hereinafter referred to as the "Servient Estate"), with the street address of 226 Q Avenue, West Wildwood, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of West Wildwood is the owner in fee of certain roadway known as Q Avenue, a municipal road of the Borough of West Wildwood (the property hereinafter referred to as the "Roadway"): and

WHEREAS, the Borough requires a storm water drainage and discharge easement (Drainage Easement, as defined herein) to transport the storm water runoff from various municipal streets, inclusive of that portion of Q Avenue which directly fronts along the portion of the Servient Estate, a distance of approximately 100+ feet ("Easement Area") upon and across a portion of the Servient Estate ( to the bay) in the location as more clearly depicted on a certain plan entitled "Proposed Storm Sewer Easement" prepared by REMINGTON, VERNICK and WAHLBERG, Engineers, dated March 6, 2017, together with the proposed Storm Sewer Easement Description, attached to the Easement agreement appended hereto and fully and collectively incorporated herein as Exhibit "1": and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners, the Governing Body of the Borough of West Wildwood Borough deems it to be in the best interest of the citizens of West Wildwood to enter into said attached easement agreement;

**NOW, THEREFORE** be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners, the Governing Body of the Borough of West Wildwood, New Jersey as follows:

- **Section 1**: The averments above are incorporated herein as if set forth at length:
- <u>Section 2:</u> The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute the Easement Agreement and all additional Borough agents, servants and employees are authorized to take such actions as may be necessary to effectuate the said agreement
- <u>Section 3.</u> If any portion of this ordinance is determined to be invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, that determination shall have no effect upon the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall remain valid and operable.

<u>Section 4</u>. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistencies only, are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 5</u>. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as provided by law.

GENERAL TRAFFIC REGULATIONS WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF WEST WILDWOOD
IN CONFORMANCE WITH TITLE 39 OF THE REVISED STATUTES OF NEW JERSEY AND
THE MANUAL OF UNIFORM TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES FOR
STREETS AND HIGHWAYS

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Borough Commission of the Borough of West Wildwood, in the County of Cape May, State of New Jersey the following additional Section is hereby incorporated as follows under ARTICLE II.

# Section 2.7 <u>Pursuant to R.S. 39:4-138.3</u> Parking in front of driveway permitted; conditions

- (a) The provisions of this section shall permit the parking of motor vehicles in front of private driveway whenever both the motor vehicle and driveway involved are owned by the same person, whenever the motor vehicle is owned by a member of the same household as the owner of the private driveway, or whenever the owner of the private driveway authorizes the parking of a motor vehicle in front of the private driveway; and where such parking is not otherwise prohibited and the permitting thereof would not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.
- (b) No person shall park a vehicle in such a location as to block the sidewalk.

**NOW BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of West Wildwood, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey that this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication, according to law.


