Reports from Commissioners:

Mayor gave the Police Activity Report for the month of August 2017 total 624 calls. (copy attached). Comm. Maxwell commented on the Ladies Auxiliary and Fire Company Open House, it was very well attended.

Comm. Golden reported 95 public work orders and the list is available. He reported on the progress on the 26th street. Peninsula.

Prior to the Mayor opening up the meeting for public comment, he stated that although he doesn't read spout off, several residents came to him regarding some comments. It is his opinion that the people who put things in spout off and don't put their names on the comments are cowards. He then informed the residents of the importance of having a police department. He emphasized the number of calls and arrests to date that our police department has handled and stated people need to be careful with the thoughts of merging with other towns. There are a lot of bad people out there and we have a very safe community with our police protection.

The Mayor also asked the residents to be aware of Hurricane Irma.

Mayor Fox opened up the meeting for public comment.

BRUCE GEDRAITIS, 641 W. Poplar Avenue, commented on the Mayor's statement about being safe, he continued stating that a half of block away got burglarized in the daytime. He was a victim of a burglary ten years ago. He doesn't buy the statement that we won't be safe if we merge with another town. He is not talking about getting rid of the Police, but questioned the Police Chiefs' salary of over \$ 100,000.00 to supervise a few men. He continued stated that we need street officers, not a chief making over \$100,000.00. Mayor will take his comment under advisement.

RICH PAUL, 33 Lake Rd., stated that we are in a fiscal crisis; his taxes went from \$2,900.00 to \$4,900.00 this year and was pro-rated from \$2,900.00 to \$5,900.00. He wanted to know if this is acceptable treatment of the taxpayers, regarding having fireworks and the police department and wanted to know his recourse. He also asked about maximum of 2% increase per year. Tax Assessor Joe Gallagher was in attendance and explained the process of assessed value. Comm. Golden stated that one of his properties went down, and the other one went up, and informed the public that we were ordered to do the revaluation by the County. Mayor Fox explained the process and also stated that the reval cost over \$100,000.00 to perform. The Mayor stated that sometimes when this happens the property taxes that went up perhaps should have been higher four or five years ago, but now they are catching up.

DENNIS FIFE, 726 W. Poplar Avenue, stated he was at last month's meeting listening and questioned the increases of General administration up 26%; Mayor & Commissioner up 56%; Municipal Clerk up 10.5%; 796 days sick time accrued; 1,381 sick days accrued, with a liability of \$164,000.00. He questioned how an employee could have so many days. Administrator Ridings believes that it is hours of time not days but will check on that information and get back to him. Mr. Fife also commented that he is all for law enforcement, but can we afford it. He believes that a 58% increase of salary for the Mayor and Commissioners is irresponsible. Mayor Fox informed him that this administration is fixing the problems created from the previous administration, and assures him that they are working on stabilizing our taxes; also the re-evaluation created a lot of the increase. Mr. Fife inquired about the shared services that the borough has with the City of Wildwood for police dispatch, courts and EMS and wanted to know what they would charge for police. Mayor Fox expressed his opinion that you wouldn't see them in the summer, due to the amount of calls they already answer. The Mayor also reminded the public about the sale of the water department, which helped offset the sewer charges. Letting the police go, in his opinion is a mistake.

ELAINE SZYMKOWIAK, 555W. Magnolia Avenue, asked who decided to give a 58% raise to the Mayor and Commissioners. Mayor stated that they did.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, stated she was at the budget meeting and raised a question about the commissioners increase, where she was told if it was listed it doesn't mean you would take it, but you did take it. She resented the comment by the mayor about people who read spout- off are cowards. Mayor Fox corrected her and stated that he said people who write into spout off and don't put their name to the comments are cowards, unlike Bruce, he signs his name to his comments. She apologized to the mayor. She said that she doesn't live here and relies on the Herald to get information. The Mayor told her to call the borough for any information she wanted. She questioned the tax rate, and wanted clarification; stating that the number of the original budget is different from her tax bill. The clerk asked her to come into the tax office on Tuesday. She wanted to know how far in arrears taxes can be before a property goes into tax sale. Solicitor Karavan explained the tax sale procedure, and the Mayor informed her that the borough has a tax sale in December.

JOHN WELSH, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, stated he is upset about his \$1,300.00 tax increase and wanted to know specifically what our leaders are going to do to drop the rates next year; cut back 58% salaries and defer blaming other people. Mayor Fox thank him for coming out to the meeting and informed him that since this administration has been in office there have not been any new lawsuits. The Mayor continued by letting the public know that tens of thousands of dollars have been expended due to the lawsuits of the previous administration; the revaluation also changed the tax rated, but things should start to stabilize next year.

Mr. Welsh asked the mayor for specific things that could be done to reduce the burden, reduce costs, make cuts and to run the borough like a business, and don't pass the buck to the County about the revaluation or lawsuits. The Mayor explained that about one third of the property taxes went up, one third stayed about the same or went down. The public safety budget is the largest. Comm. Maxwell informed the public that this administration is looking ahead to the future, they have met with the school board and are reducing school taxes.

Mr. Welsh inquired about the markers on 26th street peninsula. Comm. Golden informed him that this is an ongoing process with the Coastal Coalition, Steven's Institute and Rutgers to regenerate the peninsula. The borough is hoping to get funding from NOAA grants, and applications are being submitted to the DEP. Comm. Golden explained that due to the sensitivity of the area, and environmental impact the borough is not permitted to install a bulkhead or jetty and that the borough is hopeful this process will happen.

BILL MARTIN, 737 W. Poplar Avenue, asked if the 26th project would extend the island. Comm. Golden informed him that the borough doesn't have the final design but it would start at the far west end and work backwards. Mr. Martin thanked the commissioners for their work on getting the property at 735 W. Poplar repaired. Administrator Ridings informed the public that he has photos of the 26th peninsula project if anyone would like to see them after the meeting.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, asked if the police chief's lawsuit was settled. Solicitor Karavan informed her that it went to trial and a verdict was rendered by a jury. Mayor Fox stated that this was the last lawsuit and that the borough has not had any new ones in the six years this administration has been in office.

MIKE PATANE, 731 W. Poplar Avenue, wanted clarification on the tax increase. Comm. Maxwell explained the ten cent increase in the budget.

DENNIS FIFE, 726 W. Poplar Avenue, stated that the verdict was a lot of money and asked if the borough was going to appeal it. Mayor stated that the borough's insurance should pay the bill, and the

verdict did not award any punitive damages, which the borough would have had to pay directly. Solicitor Karavan stated that this issue can't really be discussed as the borough and the insurer are in negotiations but he feels that the borough is in a good arguable position to make sure the insurance pays the maximum. Mr. Fife asked about the workshop meeting regarding JIF. Administrator Ridings stated that the JIF representative made a presentation at the workshop meeting and offered the borough a three year renewal.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, wanted to know who pays, if the insurance company doesn't, and if the insurance company pays with the rate go up. Administrator Ridings informed her the insurance company bases it rates over a five year period, and it shouldn't impact the rate we pay.

RICH PAUL, 33 Lake Road, asked about capital and operating budgets, and questioned the Commissioners if there is any opportunity to reduce taxes. There are a lot of cop cars and asked if they are willing to cut any of that or is there a target to reduce taxes. Comm. Maxwell explained that we have received grant money for police vehicles. Mayor Fox stated that the Commissioners are always looking into ways to decrease expenses.

BRUCE GEDRAITIS, 641 W. Poplar Avenue, commented that local taxes have doubled since 2011, and asked what can be done to reduce the budget. He questioned the money used from the UEZ funding for fireworks and stated his OPRA said that two thousand dollars was used for overtime for the festival, which is a lot of money. He continued and wanted to know why the UEZ money couldn't be used to offset taxes. Mayor Fox informed him that the UEZ money could not be used to off-set taxes it was a program to promote tourism, businesses etc. Regarding the festival the Mayor will look into it for next year. Mr. Gedraitis asked if the lawsuit was settled and feels the mayor has a conflict of interest.

MIKE PATANE, 731 W. Poplar Avenue, commented that everyone has legitimate gripes, and asked if the borough needs a police chief.

BILL MARTIN, 737 W. Poplar Avenue, asked about school taxes and inquired as to how many children are in school. He continued and wanted to know if someone checks to make sure that the children actually live here. Comm. Maxwell informed him that there are forty-four students and assured him that the school board does check on residency. Mayor Fox also added that his children go to Middle Twp. as a choice school.

JOHN WELSH, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, asked if the employees are unionized. Mayor Fox informed him only the police department is represented.

RICH PAUL, 33 Lake Road, complained about the paving at Lake and P and stated that puddles have moved to Lake Rd and asked if there is a plan to regrade that area. Mayor Fox said they are working on it and believes that there will be two culverts installed in that area.

MIKE DZWONIAREK, 205 R Avenue, was concerned over the street construction work complete at his property, his gas shut-off at the curb has been covered over, and when they removed the crushed concrete from his driveway (per his complaint at a past meeting) they left piles of stones on his grass. Comm. Golden will contact the engineer.

Hearing no more public comment, the Mayor closed the public portion and thanked everyone for coming

ORDINANCE NO. 563 (2017)

"AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AN ADDITIONAL ACCESS EASEMENT FOR THE BENEFIT OF BLOCK 141 LOT 2.03"

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No 377, the Borough of West Wildwood established an easement over certain public lands for the benefit of Block 141 Lot 2.03;

WHEREAS, the Borough of West Wildwood and the owner of Block 141, Lot 2.03 are parties to litigation with regard to the boundary line of said easement and improvements erected by the property owner thereon;

WHEREAS, the parties of said litigation entered into a settlement agreement to resolve said litigation, the terms of which include, but are not limited to, the establishment of an additional access easement by the Borough of West Wildwood for the benefit of Block 141, Lot 2.03;

WHEREAS, to comply with the terms of the settlement agreement, it is necessary for the Borough of West Wildwood to establish an additional access easement for the benefit of Block 141, Lot 2.03;

- **NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINDED**, by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of West Wildwood, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey, the Governing Body of the Borough of West Wildwood, as follows:
- Section 1. The allegations of the Preamble are incorporated as if repeated at length herein.
- Section 2. An additional access easement is hereby granted by the Borough of West Wildwood (the "Grantor") for the benefit of Block 141, Lot 2.03 comprising the area set forth in the legal description attached as Exhibit A and portrayed in the drawing attached as Exhibit B, both of which are made a part hereof. The overall access easement is set forth in the legal description attached hereto as Exhibit C, also made a part hereof.
- Section 3. The owner of Block 141, Lot 2.03 (the "Grantee"), at his/her expense, shall be responsible for maintenance and upkeep of all fences, walkways, pavers, planters, landscaping, and similar improvements within the area of the additional access easement.
- Section 4. It is the intention of the Grantor that this easement shall be a permanent easement running with the land.
- Section 5. The Mayor and Clerk of the Borough of West Wildwood are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any and all additional deeds of easement and/or similar documents necessary to promote the intent of this Ordinance and to effectuate its recordation with the Clerk of Cape May County, New Jersey.

Section 6. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance, to the extent of inconsistencies only, shall be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 7. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portion of this Ordinance shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication

according to law.

IDENTIFYING CDBG FAIR HOUSING OFFICER FY2018 PUBLIC FACILITIES PROGRAMS

WHEREAS, the Borough of West Wildwood is applying for Small Cities Community Development Block Grants from the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs (hereafter NJDCA) for a new ADA Infrastructure Improvements for beach access via the dunes and at the Borough Police Station. All improvements are to bring the facilities up to current ADA standards.

WHEREAS, the Borough of West Wildwood must make efforts to affirmatively further fair housing; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of West Wildwood has reviewed various actions that would be acceptable to the New Jersey State Department of Community Affairs and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; and


