Reports from Commissioners:

Mayor asked to dispense with the reports from commissioners.

Mayor opened the meeting to floor for public comment.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, questioned the resolution acknowledging a new fire company member, and asked if it was the man from the meeting last month. Comm. Maxwell confirmed it was.

MARIE POWELL, 742 W. Glenwood Avenue, asked the difference between a workshop and regular meeting and if the public could attend the workshop meetings. Mayor Fox explained and confirmed that they are open public meetings.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, commented about workshop meetings, why and what happens at them.

DENNIS FIFE, 726 W. Poplar Avenue, directed his question to Comm. Golden regarding his new position as Public Safety Commissioner.

JOE KLINE, 750 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned access to the beach for handicap persons. Mayor explained that the borough has applied for grant money to construct a ramp for ADA and also to access the beach for clean-up purposes. Solicitor also explained that the borough was not in violation of ADA because of pre-existing conditions not a substantial improvement, borough provided reasonable access.

TRISH SINNOTT, 739 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned the mayor regarding beach access and what will be done if the grant is delayed or denied; and questioned Comm. Golden, since he is a contractor what would be the approximate costs for such construction. Comm. Golden stated he is conflicted and could not do the work.

*NANCY DOHERTY*, 215 R Avenue, questioned Comm. Golden on the amount of police vehicles. Comm. Golden stated four.

*MARY ELLEN KRIVORCHUK*, 753 W. Poplar Avenue, asked Comm. Golden to give a rough estimate on the cost to construct a ramp. Comm. Golden stated it is difficult to project due to prevailing wage requirements, but around \$200,000.

MARYANN WELSH, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, asked if the public works department could construct the ramp. Mayor Fox did not believe they could not do the construction. Ms. Welsh asked if there was any update on the Shoreline project. Mayor stated not at this time.

DAN GIFFEAR, 641 W. Glenwood Avenue, commented about the conflict concern of Comm. Golden and complained about the lack of clean up on the beach. Mayor explained that the best solution was to push the salt hay into one corner of the beach.

MR. SEGREST, 2 I Avenue, questioned the amount of grant money and the name of the grant. Mayor explained that it depends on how the state distributes the money; it is a small cities block grant.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, questioned the amount of police vehicles. Comm. Golden stated four or five.

HELEN REO, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, commented that Comm. Golden didn't know the number of police cars. Mayor stated there are four; one was sold on Gov. Deals. Ms. Reo directed her question to the solicitor and questioned the police chief signing a release about any future suit, and asked if that request has been brought to the attention of the Chief. Solicitor stated it is not advisable, and is not going to do such a thing and open up possible exposure to another suit.

ROBERT WOOD, 533 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned if the property at Glenwood and Arion commercial. Comm. Golden stated it is commercial. Mr. Wood questioned how many police officers are full time. Comm. Golden stated three not including the chief. Mr. Wood asked what the chief does. Comm. Golden stated that she is the administrative officer in charge of all operations of the police department and oversees all shifts.

TRISH SINNOTT, 739 W. Poplar Avenue, directed comment to the solicitor, inquiring about Robert's Rules of Order, that the borough uses a modified version. Solicitor explained the process takes place for the New Year, commissioners set up the rules to govern the year. Ms. Sinnott, then asked about prior meeting questions. Solicitor informed her to ask the questions. Ms. Sinnott continued questioning the reconsideration of the Judge's decision. Solicitor explained that the reconsideration was denied and an appeal has been filed. Ms. Sinnott asked the time frame for an appeal. Solicitor explained possibly eight to nine months. Ms. Sinnott questioned the list of charges against the chief. Solicitor explained that this was discussed last month, it is a personnel matter and not able to be released, if it was presented to the court as part of the proceedings the court would have that information, but the borough can't release it. Ms. Sinnott questioned the mayor regarding the conflict of interest; what changed his mind about switching departments. Mayor Fox explained that it was discussed at the last meeting and he thought about it and decided to switch departments. Ms. Sinnott asked for an update on the Mawhinney case.

Solicitor explained JIF is defending the case and has assigned an attorney, he explained that sometimes it goes to mediation it depends on JIF.

*JOE KLINE*, 750 W. Poplar Avenue, asked hypothetically what would happen if the case is lost; what is the borough's exposure. Solicitor explained the reservation of rights, that only certain things are covered, the borough would be responsible for punitive damages and wages, and maybe some retainage.

STEVE SAMSON, 205 O Avenue, questioned the consolidation of services with another police department. Comm. Golden stated he hasn't talked about it. Mr. Samson stated that somewhere in South Jersey it happened and cut the costs in half, again asked about considering consolidation. Comm. Golden stated that it would probably have to go to a referendum. Solicitor stated that only registered voters could vote. Mayor stated he would not get rid of the police department. Mr. Sampson stated that it is the job of the commissioners to do what is best for the borough. Mayor stated it can be put on a referendum and voted on.

ROBERT WOOD, 533 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned the cost for Wildwood to patrol. Comm. Golden stated he would look into it and get numbers, and would have to find out the legalities. Solicitor explained consolidation, and stated that once you get rid of it, it is very hard to get it back.

MARIE POWELL, 742 W. Glenwood Avenue, asked what would have to be done to stop the bleeding from lawsuits, and commented that she doesn't know if consolidation is the answer. Ms. Powell stated that these meetings just keep going in circles regarding the police department; she suggests taking a step back to look at the police department and make changes or recommendations on improvements to the police department. Comm. Golden stated he only believes in the consolidation of all four communities, and will look at all expenses, and stated that the only issues in the police department was ten years ago, and there are no other legal issues with the operation of the police department.

*TOM FLORKOWSKI*, 609 W. Poplar Avenue, stated he doesn't think that the borough has any protection, his house was broken into and they used hammers and chisels on eight windows. He stated that every house in the area was broken into and questioned the response from the police department.

MARYANN WELSH, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, inquired if volunteers could research at where improvements could be made in the police department and negotiate shared services. Solicitor explained that the number of calls for service can be obtained through OPRA. Solicitor explained the process briefly regarding the dissolvement of the police department, stating that he was involved with Cape May Point, West Cape May merger with Cape May City, it is very complex. Comm. Golden stated that he did not know the answer.

MARIE POWELL, 742 W. Glenwood Avenue, wanted to make it perfectly clear that she is not advocating consolidation of the police department.

*NANCY DOHERTY*, 215 R Avenue, commented that Cape May Point doesn't have a police department and their taxes are less and they are a Walsh act community. Solicitor stated that they have no school children.

MARY ELLEN KRIVORCHUK, 753 W. Poplar Avenue, commented that the police officers are very nice, and make a pittance, they all carry guns and they are out there protecting us; the amount of pay is an insult. Comm. Golden stated that he just took over the department and to give him a chance to go through paperwork.

SCOTT JOHANSKI, 730 W. Glenwood, stated it was disheartening that consolidation is not even being considered and wanted to know a list of itemized specific crimes, amount of tickets. Mr. Johanski continued and stated that the three commissioners didn't consider it and it is a disgrace that it was not looked at. Solicitor stated that the UCR has a list of calls.

MARIE POWELL, 742 W. Glenwood Avenue, stated as a full time resident having the police department is invaluable and a deterrent.

KATE SAMSON, 205 O Avenue, commented that dispatching services are from another department so why can't the duties of the chief go through another department, don't get rid of the whole department, why can't the administrating of the department be done by another department. Ms. Samson questioned if a chief is needed. Solicitor stated that New Jersey statutes govern this, along with the Police Chiefs' Bill of Rights, you can't get rid of them, and if the chief retired you could go with a Director of Public Safety. Ms. Samson questioned position of Class II police officers. Solicitor explained the position and that the prosecutor allows them to be kept on year round, the municipality saves money because they are part-time.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, questioned if the chief does administrative things, does she patrol. Comm. Golden stated that 99% of the time she is not on patrol but is always on call. Ms. Czwalina stated if there are four police officers, why not have the chief patrol and get rid of one cop. Ms. Czwalina asked why the police and public works reports are no longer given at the meetings. Mayor Fox and Comm. Golden stated they will bring back the reports. Ms. Czwalina inquired as to how may lawsuit are out there. Mayor Fox stated that there are no other suits. Ms. Czwalina questions a suit regarding Palombaro. Mayor state that there is no litigation, clerk confirmed that she has not received any filing regarding a new lawsuit. Ms. Czwalina questioned auto lease payments; ACA computer IT services costs; auditor's costs; and questioned if Comm. Golden would give up his health insurance benefits or do single coverage with no child. Comm. Maxwell informed Ms. Czwalina that she can contact the CFO on Monday to get the answers to her questions. Comm. Golden stated he will not give up his medical benefits; he is basically on call 24/7.

LINDA DOOLEY, 600 O Avenue, asked Comm. Golden if he had another job. Comm. Golden confirmed that he does.

DORIS BORKOWSKI, 517 W. Poplar Avenue, stated that she has a problem with Comm. Golden's statement that he works 24/7, and has no answers to five questions asked.

BOB SINNOTT, 739 W. Poplar Avenue, stated he is concerned over the new lawsuit and wanted to know what assurances are in place that the borough won't be in violation of the cooperation clause with JIF like in the Ferentz case. Solicitor stated that sometimes opinions vary, which cause the differences in ones actions relating to litigation, regarding the cooperation clause; the past administration took actions; this administration reversed the course of action. Solicitor stated it was the Chief's decision to separate this individual from employment, not the sitting Commissioners.

HELEN REO, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, asked what type of case is the Mawhinney suit. Solicitor stated it is a civil (whistle blower) case. Ms. Reo asked about the coverage for the borough. Solicitor stated that punitive damages and wages are not covered by insurance.

SCOTT LIMPAR, 730 W. Glenwood Avenue, asked if the engineering has been done for the beach ramp. Mayor stated no. Mr. Limpar stated that the borough should have the design for the ramp prior to bid. Mayor confirmed stating the borough engineer handled the grant application. Mr. Limpar state he is an engineer and will design it for free.

*KATE SAMSON*, 205 O Avenue, stated that Carl (deputy clerk) has been working on compiling a report of spending regarding the million dollar surplus, and as soon as she gets the information she will inform the public.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, stated that there was a meeting of the Concerned Taxpayers of West Wildwood, letters were sent out to all property owners, and wanted to let the commissioners they would like to extend an olive branch and help in anyway. Ms. Czwalina questioned why there was a charge to rent the hall. Clerk explained the resolution regarding the use of borough facilities. All three commissioners stated they did not receive any letter regarding the meeting; the Mayor stated if he received one he would have attended the meeting. Comm. Golden stated that we all work together, and would like to see people involved, and that the commissioners are open to suggestions, if something can be improved upon.

JIM QUINN, 712 W. Maple Avenue, motioned to suspend the meeting.

*NANCY DOHERTY*, 215 R Avenue, stated that she has lived on the island since the 50's, and she never remembers a charge for the borough hall; and asked if the ladies auxiliary pays. Clerk explained that the ladies auxiliary and Fire Company are entities of the borough; therefore they do not pay to use the facilities.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, asked if the fee could be waived and they would just pay the insurance.

JOE SEGREST, 2 I Avenue, questioned the sewer charges and stated that when the water was consolidated the fees went down, so why not consolidate the sewer.

LINDA DOOLING, 600 North Drive, #221, stated that the Holly Bay condo Association has been meeting in the borough hall for fifteen years for free. Mayor stated that they should not have gotten it for free. Ms. Dooling stated they are going to meet in the library, it is free.

*DENNIS FIFE*, 726 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned Comm. Golden regarding the rank and file of the police department. Comm. Golden stated there is a Chief, Sgt. and patrolmen.

*PAUL MATUSZAK*, 612 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned Comm. Golden regarding his back taxes. Comm. Golden stated he is behind, it's his business, and he pays interest.

TRISH SINNOTT, 739 W. Poplar Avenue, checked the borough website and stated that there is a Chief, Sgt. and five officers.

MARIE POWELL, 742 W. Glenwood Avenue, stated a Chief, Sgt. three officers and two class II officers.

Hearing no more public comment, the Mayor closed the public portion and asked for a motion to adjourn. Clerk asked for a motion to adjourn.

# AUTHORIZING A SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE CAPE MAY COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY FOR SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL AND RECYCLING SERVICES

WHEREAS, the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority ("CMCMUA"/Authority") owns and operates a solid waste system ("System") which presently serves the entire County of Cape May in the State of New Jersey, for the disposal, transfer, and recycling of solid waste; and

WHEREAS, the CMCMUA's System is comprised of the CMCMUA's Secure Sanitary Landfill, Solid Waste Transfer Station, and Intermediate Processing Facility, as well as several recycling operations and programs; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of West Wildwood has utilized and desires to continue to utilize the services of the CMCMUA's System; and

WHEREAS, there presently exists a contract between the Borough of West Wildwood and the Authority for the use of the CMCMUA's System for the disposal, transfer, and recycling of solid waste which will expire on December 31, 2018 entitled "Shared Services Agreement for Solid Waste Disposal" (the "Existing Agreement"); and
