#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Administrator Ridings addressed questions submitted by the Concerned Taxpayers of West Wildwood (herein referred to as CTWWW), and asked Solicitor Blaney to explain what a "Brady Letter" means. Solicitor stated there was a question if a Brady Letter was issued to the Chief, answering that in his opinion there was never a Brady Letter issued to the Chief, what was on a Pre-Brady letter issued then placed on the Brady list by the Prosecutor; and explained that the Chief can still do her job, if an arrest is made it the information about the Brady list must be disclosed in a criminal trial to the defendant's attorney, solicitor's understanding for the reason for that letter charges base charges and allegations that she was untruthful which were dropped, but the Prosecutor was not going to remove her from the list. Solicitor addressed questions from the public.

ANN DOHERTY, 215 R Avenue, asked what year it was issued. Solicitor back when the discipline was going on before 2010. Solicitor stated he doesn't was to get into specifics, because the Chief has not been RICE noticed.

CHARLES CHEPAK, 507 W. Poplar Avenue, asked several questions and comments. Why would you hire an officer on the Brady list, should have checks and balances, was it disclosed she was on the list; stated it was a poor decision; should have asked JIF's opinion. Solicitor stated that generally JIF will not give you that advise, they will give you advise on handling litigation. Solicitor stated that the allegations

were not adjudicated and commented that if an officer is found to be guilty of lying, they are generally terminated, in this circumstance there has never been a Judicial determination. Mr. Chepak stated that it should be looked at from the taxpayer's viewpoint, if someone is on the list, avoid hiring. Comm. Golden stated hiring should be looked at on a case by case basis. Mayor stated you must look at everything. Mr. Chepak asked if the prosecutor would have a problem with someone on the list that was not adjudicated, what is the process to remove someone from the list. Mr. Chepak questioned Comm. Maxwell's opinion on hiring someone on the list. Comm. Maxwell stated he would go by legal counsel advised and declined to answer a hypothetical question.

JOHN BANNING, 711 W. Poplar Avenue, stated the International Assoc. Chief of Police, and NJ State Chief of Police and Internal Affairs recommends not to hire, and they are fired, because they are a liability. Solicitor stated he never said he would hire someone on the list, in most cases they would not be hired, but you have to do a case by case basis. Directed his comment to Comm. Golden stating that he knew there was a Brady letter and he should have done a background before bringing her back. Comm. Golden stated he was unaware of any letter and relied on legal counsel at the time to bring her back. Solicitor stated the Chief has a right to be RICE Noticed and the commissioners should not discuss specifics, she has a right under RICE to be notified that her name is being brought up, the question was is there a Brady letter and it was answered, it is a public document and she does not have to be RICED to answer the question. Mr. Banning asked if Comm. Golden would bring her in on a major crime scene, and then answered that he would not because it is a liability; questioned when she was made Chief did you review. Comm. Golden stated he relied on legal counsel, and he was not in charge of the police department at the time. Mr. Banning stated that he passed the resolution, as did Comm. Maxwell. Comm. Maxwell stated we need to get back to the meeting.

*JOE KLINE*, 750 W. Poplar Avenue, asked if the Chief is not on the street because of the recommendation from counsel not to put her on the street. Solicitor stated he has seen her on the street and did not advise her to not be on the street.

MARYELLEN ZAJAK, 753 W. Poplar Avenue, wanted to know the implications for the Officer Mahinney, if she let him go what would happen in that instance, and stated there could be liability. Solicitor stated it is a public record and his attorney can get it. Solicitor will not discuss pending litigation, not an issue.

HELEN REO, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, stated the resolutions were passed after this brady letter was issued, resolution passed in 2012, the letter issued around 2008, and stated she asked Comm. Golden on several past meetings what was considered in bringing her back. She was aware she was put on notice about the letter. Mayor stated that an attorney was hired to look into this case, and everything that they said she did was lies, we are going to find out. Ms. Reo stated she has been on this list for ten years and has never taken steps to look into this. Mayor stated that we have to be very careful, its recorded. Ms. Reo continued questioning how the salary was determined, by Comm. Golden looking into other salaries.

*MARYANN WELSH*, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned the RICE notice, and asked why she does not attend these meetings. Ms. Welsh stated that in the trial transcripts she stated she had a brady letter and could not seek employment elsewhere.

Administrator Ridings continued to address the submitted questions explaining that Mayor Fox could not attend the Wildwood Mayor's meeting and briefed him, and he attended on the Mayor's behalf. Mayor stated he brief Mr. Ridings and represented the borough in an honest and good way. Questioned the progress on the update of the Master Plan. The Master Plan needs only minor changes, the planning board committed hoping to have something in June. Update on sewer system, code enforcement, only a few let to comply, should be done shortly. No update on the living shoreline. Update on Mahinney, hearing date on June 13. JIF appeal no status on oral argument.

Mayor asked the clerk to continue.

#### **REPORTS FROM COMMISSIONERS**

Mayor gave the DPW report for the month of April 2019 (copy attached)

Comm. Golden gave the Police Activity Report for the month of April 2019 (copy attached)

Comm. Maxwell gave the account overview report for the month of April 2019 (copy attached)

Mayor informed the public the Ladies Auxiliary is having a hoagie sale fundraiser and Lori Perloff has tickets if anyone is interested.

Mayor opened the meeting to floor for public comment.

HELEN REO, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned the hiring of conflict counsel. Mayor stated for all conflict cases throughout the borough, if our solicitor has conflicts with county. Solicitor explained he is does labor work many municipalities and the county so he can't be in an adversarial position to the prosecutor. Mr. Hegerty is going to look into the brady letter, generally all municipalities have a conflict counsel. Ms. Reo asked what this person is going to look into regarding the brady letter. Solicitor stated he thinks he will deal with the prosecutor to see if it is an appropriate letter and what to do with it. Ms. Reo stated that the person who has the brady letter should hire their own attorney, we should not be paying for this, she had this letter before, and stated she feels it is not fair to pay for it. Mayor asked clerk to clarify that this appointment is to handle all conflict matters, clerk affirmed.

*NANCY DOHERTY*, 215 R Avenue, questioned Comm. Golden that she did not hear on his police report that they broke into her house, informed the commissioner that she heard a lot of banging and asked it the borough is going to pay to fix her damaged storm door. Administrator stated that her neighbor called concerned about her welfare, the officer responded as a well-being check and did not get a response, so he entered. Administrator Riding asked Ms. Doherty to call him tomorrow.

*KATE SAMSON*, 205 O Avenue, questioned the hiring of Nicole Fox, understands that it is legal, the borough has been sued by your brother, your girlfriend and now you are hiring another family member, there is a conflict of interest. Mayor stated, she is local, qualified and has credentials, pays taxes. Ms. Samson is not questioning her credentials. Mayor stated to give that person a chance.

JOE KLINE, 750 W. Poplar Avenue, my uncle gave me my first job, why would you want to bring your daughter into this environment.

*JAN ANTRIM* 786 W. Glenwood asked if the borough has a policy on workplace conflict/nepotism. Mayor stated that the JIF has a policy that we follow.

DOROTHY DALTON, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, JIF recommended you not rehire Ferentz you di it and increased the chief's salary, you pick and choose the JIF guidelines that work for you. Mayor stated that when you know all the facts then you may reconsider what you say.

CHARLES CHEPAK, 507 W. Poplar Avenue, commented when he listened to the meetings he was not able to attend, I am charging you all with conspiracy, you obviously knew in advance that you were hiring your daughter, you knowingly had the understanding when you denied a nepotism policy.

*JOHN BANNING*, 711 W. Poplar Avenue, you may not have known what happened in the past, but the prosecutor is the top law enforcement in the county, August 2018 stated that none of the officers you knew had a brady letter. Comm. Golden, stated he was unaware that there was a brady letter. Mr. Banning stated that Comm. Golden was negligent when she was hired back.

*KATE SAMSON*, 205 O Avenue, jobs are connected to hiring friends and family and people assume they should still have their, people may use there job when the administration changes; with this borough we seem to get sued by it, many job related lawsuits, this needs to be address this issue.

KAREN KIERSEY, 651 W. Poplar Avenue, commented that she talked to the Mayor regarding a conflict of interest for him to oversee public safety and he changed departments. Mayor stated he still does not feel that there was a conflict. Ms. Kiersey continued stating she likes his daughter, but the borough can't afford another possible lawsuit, nepotism, and stated it just doesn't look right, it doesn't pass the sniff test; questioned if the mayor's intension is to move her up, it looks like a set up. Mayor stated to give her a chance, and hopes she is the chief here one day.

*JAN ANTRIM*, 786 W. Glenwood Avenue, asked how many candidates applied and how long was it advertised; what is the salary range Comm. Golden stated two, and it was advertised on policeapp.com for about a month.

JOHN BANNING, 711 W. Poplar Avenue, asked if any other notices.

*HELEN REO*, 741 w. Poplar Avenue, directed her remarks to the Solicitor regarding the new hire and conflict between the Mayor and the Chief overseeing the Mayor's daughter.

CHARLES CHEPAK, 507 W. Poplar Avenue, asked if the clerk would slow down when reading out ordinances and resolutions. Clerk confirmed. He then stated there should be a plan to follow for issues, problems, and asked the solicitor if the chief should not be supervisory authority over the officer and stated the Mayor will be in the opposite position of defending his daughter, when he should be neutral. Solicitor stated he can't discuss, he advises the municipality not everyone in the municipality, and can't waive that privilege, so he can't answer.

HELEN REO, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned Comm. Golden about the bringing back the officer, promotion, big increase and she didn't disclose that she had a brady letter. Solicitor stated the letter was handed over to the previous administration and stated this will not be discussed due to no RICE notice issuance. Ms. Reo continued stating to put the chief on notice, and that the chief should be paying for the removal of the brady letter, issued ten years ago.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, asked the cost of mediation and if it is open to the public. Solicitor stated charges are hourly and split in half, about \$350-\$450 range depending on the mediator,

and it is confidential until or unless a settlement agreement is reached then it becomes public. Ms. Czwalina continued inquiring about the ADA beach access ramp; the appointment of the two officers and where it was advertised; where did the other officer go; questioned the Jacobs & Barbone costs and if any word on the appeal; questioned items on the police report; who gives performance evaluations; budget introduction; communications costs; and asked how the additional money for the judgement is paid. Comm. Maxwell stated the staff is working four - nine-hour days at full rate from before the furloughs with no pay increases.

*KATE SAMSON*, 205 O Avenue, commented employees are working four days, closed on Fridays; meetings are on Wednesday's at 3:00pm and the majority of people can't attend; and questioned the mediation process. Solicitor explained the mediation process, which is court ordered.

*HELEN REO*, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, commented about the meeting times and stated it is to discourage taxpayers to attend, and asked if the commissioners would reconsider rescheduling back to evening meetings.

*ELAINE SZYMKOWIAK*, 555 W. Magnolia Avenue, questioned if there has been a change in building permits. Mayor stated that certain improvements no longer require permits, such as siding, windows, roofs.

*JOE KLINE*, 750 W. Poplar Avenue, questions costs of settlement, mediation, legal, and the timing of the flood siren. Administrator informed the public that the timer on the siren is bad and is on schedule to be repaired or replaced.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, asked if the sewer bill is the same. Mayor confirmed.

JAN ANTRIM, 786 W. Glenwood Avenue, asked if personnel could rotate the day off so the office could be open on Friday's.

MARYANN WELSH, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned if the hiring of Conflict Counsel, is he reviewing the hiring of Nicole Fox. and is fearful of another conflict of interest over the hiring of Nicole Fox. Solicitor stated she is already hired; Comm. Maxwell does not have a problem with the hire. Ms. Welsh stated she does not have a problem with her, she doesn't know her, and questioned why she was not mentioned when there were nepotism discussions. Mayor stated she was mentioned at previous meetings. Solicitor stated that JIF reviews and implements new policies and the borough adopts them, there is no law that states you must have a nepotism ordinance.

*JAN ANTRIM*, 786 W. Glenwood Avenue, stated that H.R. policies have guidelines, give guidance, processes if someone is not performing, including an annual review, and asked if there is mandatory training. Solicitor state we have policies, handbook, and follow them, but it doesn't prevent someone from bringing a suit.

CHARLES CHEPAK, 507 W. Poplar Avenue, read out the definition of nepotism from his phone; and questioned who does evaluations. Solicitor stated that New Jersey does not have a nepotism law. Administrator Ridings stated no written evaluations, if there is an issue a performance notice would be written. Solicitor stated the Police Chief by statute in New Jersey reports to Comm. Golden. Comm. Golden can not interfere with the day to day operations of the police department., he runs policy, budget matters and the Chief is in charge of discipline if an officer is not doing their job. Mr. Chepak asked if verbal evaluations are done in the police department. Administrator Ridings stated he talks to all employees, at the end of the year, any written evaluations are not a public document.

HELEN REO, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, stated written performance appraisals should be adopted. Mayor stated he will agree to disagree.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, asked if there are any other lawsuits. Commissioners stated they are not aware of any. Ms. Czwalina asked to have it on record that the she does not wish to have an adversarial position with the commissioners, she goes over things at the meeting so other people know. Comm. Maxwell stated he has no problem.

Hearing no more public comment, the Mayor closed the public portion. Clerk asked for a motion to adjourn.
