OLD BUSINESS

Mayor asked if there was any old business, then commented that Administrator Ridings is leaving, he has a new job. Mayor thanked Chris for his service and asked Admin. Ridings if he wanted to say anything. Administrator Ridings thanked everyone from the community, the commissioners and informed the public that his wife was the Pastor at the United Methodist Church in Green Creek for the past nine years and has been reassigned to Almonesson, near Deptford, housing is provided and although he considered the drive (72 miles) back and forth, he has taken a job in Gloucester County. Administrator Ridings thanked the Mayor and Commissioner and the public for the opportunity and public respect. Comm. Golden thanked Administrator Ridings for his service.

Mayor informed the public of the 4th of July parade will start at 10:30. Administrator Ridings stated that decorations will be given out starting at 8:00am and hot dogs, soft pretzels and water will be served afterwards, Wawa donated ten cases of water.

Mayor opened the meeting to floor for public comment.

JOE KLINE, 750 W. Poplar Avenue, commented that Chris Ridings did a great job, and stated he read an article paper for a town of our size there is not a need for an administrator, the clerk handles the work, and asked if the commissioners intended to hire another administrator. Mayor stated he has not considered it at this time and when he was Mayor from 1996 to 2008 there was no administrator; the administrator position came in under Mayor Frederick; he would take it under consideration; you can't dump everything on the clerk.

BOB BRADLEY, 649 W. Glenwood Avenue, asked if Chris (Ridings) was hired by Frederick (former mayor). Administrator Ridings confirmed that he was hired in 2011 by former Mayor Frederick.

MARYANN WELSH, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, asked for an update on the Mawhinney case. Solicitor stated the case went to mediation and was not resolved; it is in the discovery stage. Ms. Welsh asked if it could still be resolved; who attended the mediation. Solicitor stated there is always a possibility for it to be resolved and JIF attorney James Birchmeier is handling the case. Mayor Fox stated that he along with Administrator Ridings was in attendance.

HELEN REO, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned the mediation not resolving the case, and questioned the Brady letter. Solicitor stated it will not be discussed, the matter is in litigation and the JIF attorney will handle that matter.

JIM ASMAN, 600 North Drive, Unit 213, questioned the traffic situation at "O" Avenue condos, stating there is a one way sign directing the flow of traffic on condo property, but the property owner at the end of the street won't let the cars drive through, they blocked it. Mayor informed him the lot in question is privately owned, not borough property, the borough did not put up the sign; and you would have to talk to the property owner.

JOE KLINE, 750 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned the beach access progress; the cost of the project and the amount left over from the \$400,000 grant. Administrator Ridings stated the project came in under the engineer's estimate at \$170,000, with a couple of changes, then the ramp for the police department will go out to bid; the grant is job specific any unspent funds go back to the state.

BOB BRADLEY, 649 W. Glenwood Avenue, asked who takes care of the bid process. Mayor Fox stated the borough engineer handled the bid.

MARYELLEN ZAKAK, 753 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned if the chief oversaw Mawhinney...Solicitor interrupted her stating the case is pending litigation and will not be discussed.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, thanked the commissioners for the beach clean-up; questioned if properties with pools need to be fenced; asked what COAH is; questioned the progress of the properties capping off open sewer vents. Mayor stated that the pool area needs to

be fenced; sewer vents are done but will double check. Solicitor explained COAH, Counsel on affordable housing, and explained COAH immunity for West Wildwood until 2025.

LIZ McCANN, 5 J Avenue, stated she has been here for thirty-two years and J Avenue constantly floods, and wanted to know when J Avenue is going to be fixed. Mayor stated that road work projects along with valves will be taking place and J avenue will be in there.

JIM ASMAN, 600 North Drive, Unit 213, questioned the mayor's suggestion from the last meeting regarding combining of all the Wildwood's and asked what the advantage is, and commented why anyone would want to combine with us. Mayor stated believes all four municipalities should merge, there is a lot that goes into it, there would be a referendum for all voters.

JOE KLINE, 750 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned the COAH fee refund. Solicitor explained that the fees are related to new construction and under the instruction of counsel are being refunded.

BOB BRADLEY, 649 W. Glenwood Avenue, questioned Comm. Golden about the 316 property checks performed by the police department, stating it is an inefficient use of personnel.

MARYANN JOYCE, 546 W. Pine Avenue, commented about water sitting in front of her house since the streets around her were built up and questioned what can be done to correct it. Mayor stated new larger outfall lines and road work should help. Ms. Joyce asked if some plan of the street work is on file. Mayor said the engineers have information and will let her know.

MARK MEEHAN, 606 W. Glenwood Avenue, commented about his taxes, and the increase in his taxes and questioned the amount of taxes Comm. Golden pays on his new home. Comm. Golden stated he pays \$13,000.00.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, asked about resolution 2019-056 cost; resolution 2019-060 hiring of police officer; the additional cost of out of county training for new officers. Comm. Golden explained that a couple of officers are in the National Guard and are going to training and the shifts need to be covered; the Chief has not yet informed him about the new officers training schedule.

BOB BRADLEY, 649 W. Glenwood Avenue, questioned the Chief's hours, stating that Comm. Golden is in charge of the police. Comm. Golden stated that he is not in charge of the day to day operation of the police department and the chief works forty hours and is on call.

DENISE SMALLEY, 213 N Avenue, commented that the Chief has no boss, and asked who checks. Comm. Golden stops in three to four times a week.

BOB BRADLEY, 649 W. Glenwood Avenue, questioned how many patrols; what does the Chief do in the day and can he walk in to talk to her. Comm. Golden stated the Chief oversees patrol and the administrative matters of the department works from 7-4, 5 days a week and in emergencies when needed.

DEB FOX, 634 W. Poplar Avenue, commented she doesn't know of any other town, like Bob Regalbutta from the City of Wildwood if he patrols around town, chiefs have tons of meetings, they are in administration, they have to go to different updates, saying she is there everyday from 7-3 and you could walk in the door and see her I don't know if that would be possible.

HELEN REO, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, commented the police patrol 24/7 and asked if the Chief does patrols. Comm. Golden talked to the Chief and she does patrols. Ms. Reo asked the cost to date of conflict counsel; how many issues he is working on; any discussions on filling former Comm. Maxwell's slot; and what is the norm for filling it. Mayor stated the matter of filling the spot has not been discussed. Solicitor stated under the Walsh Act, Commission form of government there is no need to act to fill the position.

JOE MELLAR, 203 J Avenue, commented that we can't afford to lose another lawsuit and asked if the attorney is the same. Solicitor stated the attorney handling the appeal is the same. Mayor stated there are different attorneys on the other lawsuits.

JOE KLINE, 750 W. Poplar Avenue, commented he sees new faces at the meeting maybe due to the holiday and asked if the commissioners would consider changing the meeting back to Friday evenings so everyone could attend.

DEB FOX, 634 W. Poplar Avenue, commented on going back to Friday night meetings, and read off a list of other county municipalities meeting times, stating that if the town was merged the meetings still would probably not be on Friday nights.

DAN GUIFEAR, 641 W. Glenwood Avenue, commented the meetings have always been on Friday nights until recently; commented that the CTWWW had paid for the hall and there is a wine stain on the floor that did not get cleaned up. Clerk commented that if may have been her that spilled a birch beer soda. Mr. Guifear stated no; it was red wine.

HELEN REO, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, stated the meetings were held on Friday's for forty years, and going to a softball game is no good reason for making the change.

JIM ASMAN, 600 North Drive, Unit 213, commented the pool at Holly Bay Condos is completely fenced in and they had some issues with renters using the pool, kids sneak in, the police came twice and did a good job, asked what happens. Mayor stated the condo is responsible if something happens.

TRISH SINNOTT, 739 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned the Mayor about missing a meeting in December and stated Comm. Maxwell ran it, there was an issue because of the tree lighting and a letter was sent to change the borough meeting, no response; then told can't change the meeting date. Ms. Sinnott asked about the status of the master plan and is it past the deadline due date; who will oversee the beach access project.; how many legal situations is the mayor involved in. Mayor stated the master plan should be completed shortly; he will oversee the beach project and paperwork.

DON YONKUNAS, 621 W. Glenwood Avenue, explained that he stopped into the office regarding a racoon issue, and went to the police department to get animal control involved. Mr. Yonkunas called animal control and they said they don't take care of West Wildwood. Clerk explained the conversation in the office to commissioners, it may have been a mis communication, but the borough does have animal control. Administrator Ridings stated the borough code enforcement officer has called in pest control and the charges will be result in a lien on the property.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, questioned what prisoner transfer and thefts from the police activity report is. Mayor stated it could be someone was arrested and transported to the county jail. Comm. Golden stated there were no thefts reported. Ms. Czwalina questioned the hiring of the general hearing officer. Mayor stated he can handle any matters. Solicitor explained the hearing officer appointment does not necessarily mean there is something pending.

MARYANN WELSH, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, asked for update on the living shoreline; and is there an issue with crossing a property.

Administrator Riding stated the plan has been filed with Tideland and is in the review stage; the borough is moving ahead with eminent domain procedures and the matter should be resolved soon.

TRISH SINNOTT, 739 W. Poplar Avenue, question if the Chief of Police missed a few meetings of police chiefs. I think there may be absences. Comm. Goldens was not aware of any missed meetings, chamber of commerce luncheon, but it is not mandatory.

JANET ANTRIM, 786 W. Glenwood Avenue, questioned if there was a referendum to merge the Wildwoods' could taxpayers vote. Mayor stated registered voters.

Hearing no more public comment, the Mayor closed the public portion., thanked everyone from coming out and enjoy the holiday, and encouraged everyone to bring their kids out for the parade tomorrow.

Clerk asked for a motion to adjourn.

ORDINANCE 573(2019)

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE USAGE OF THE VARIABLE MESSAGE SIGN BOARD AND ESTABLISHING THE RULES, REGULATIONS AND FEES

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of West Wildwood have deemed it in the best interest to support and promote the businesses established within the Borough and create an atmosphere to enhance the opportunity for businesses to expand; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has a variable message sign board located at the entrance which provides information to both taxpayers and visitors to our community; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners desire to make available to the business community the opportunity to promote their businesses through the usage of the variable message sign board.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of West Wildwood, County of Cape May, New Jersey, as follows:

Section I: Definitions

- 1. Businesses for the purpose of this ordinance are defined as follows:
 - a. A company engaged in commerce, selling goods and/or services.
 - b. Have a brick and mortar location within the Borough of West Wildwood.
 - c. Have a valid New Jersey Business Registration Certificate.
 - d. Hold a current mercantile license issued by the Borough of West Wildwood.

Section II: Rules and Regulations

- 1. The use of the variable message sign board is as follows:
 - a. The Borough shall have the authority to approve the content of all messages.
 - b. Should the Borough determine there is a public safety need, the use of the sign will revert to the Borough until it is no longer needed; no monetary refunds will be given; the advertising business affected will be credited with the time to be re-scheduled at a later day.
 - c. Sign usage shall be on a first come first serve basis.
 - d. Each business shall be limited to seven (7) days per month.
 - e. Sign usage on Friday, Saturday and Sunday shall be grouped together and shall be considered only for three (3) day rentals.
 - f. Applications shall be available through the Office of the Clerk.

- g. The Mayor and/or the Commissioners or his/her designee shall review each application to determine eligibility.
- h. Usage dates shall be at the sole discretion of the Mayor and/or Commissioners or his/her designee.

Section III: Fees

- 1. The fee schedule is as follows:
 - a. A \$10.00 per day fee, payable to the Borough of West Wildwood.
 - b. No monetary refunds, time credit shall be permitted.

Section IV. Survival

Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, at to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

Section V. Effective Date of Ordinance

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication, according to law.

ORDINANCE 574 (2019)

LITTER CONTROL ORDINANCE

SECTION I – PURPOSE:

An Ordinance to establish requirements to control littering in the Borough of West Wildwood, so as to protect public health, safety and welfare, and to prescribe penalties for the failure to comply.

SECTION II - DEFINITIONS:

For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meanings stated herein unless their use in the text of this Chapter clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words used in the plural number include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

- a. Litter any used or unconsumed substance or waste material which has been discarded, whether made of aluminum, glass, plastic, rubber, paper, or other natural or synthetic material, or any combination thereof, including, but not limited to, any bottle, jar or can, or any top, cap or detachable tab of any bottle, jar or can, any unlighted cigarette, cigar, match or any flaming or glowing material or any garbage, trash, refuse, debris, rubbish, grass clippings or other lawn or garden waste, newspapers, magazines, glass, metal, plastic or paper containers or other packaging or construction material, but does not include the waste of any primary processes of mining or other extraction processes, logging, sawmilling, farming or manufacturing.
- b. Litter Receptacle a container suitable for the depositing of litter.
- c. Person any individual, corporation, company, partnership, firm, association, or political subdivision of this State subject to municipal jurisdiction.

SECTION III - PROHIBITED ACTS AND REGULATED ACTIVITIES:

- 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to throw, drop, discard or otherwise place any litter of any nature upon public or private property other than in a litter receptacle, or having done so, to allow such litter to remain.
- 2. Whenever any litter is thrown or discarded or allowed to fall from a vehicle or boat in violation of this Ordinance, the operator or owner, or both, of the motor vehicle or boat shall also be deemed to have violated this Ordinance.

SECTION IV - ENFORCEMENT:

This Ordinance shall be enforced by the Police Department and/or other Municipal Officials in the Borough of West Wildwood.

SECTION V - PENALTIES:

Any person(s) who is found to be in violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to a fine not to exceed one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars.

SECTION VI - SEVERABILITY:

Each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase of this Ordinance is declared to be an independent section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase, and the finding or holding of any such portion of this Ordinance to be unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause, or reason, shall not affect any other portion of this Ordinance.

SECTION VII – EFFECTIVE DATE:

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and any publication as may be required by law.
