Mayor Fox called the meeting to order, led the Pledge of Allegiance and read the OPMA statement

Clerk informed the Commissioners the minutes for October are not completed at this time.

OLD BUSINESS:

Clerk informed Commissioners the 2019 Best Practices Inventory Questionnaire was filed, and the Borough qualifies for state aid under the provisions of the formula.

The CTWWW submitted a series of matters that were addressed as follows:

Deputy Clerk Carl O'Hala gave updates on the Living Shore Line, regarding land acquisition and funding; explained the CRS program to lower flood insurance rates.

Solicitor gave an update on the Mulhinney litigation, stating it is in the discovery stage.

Mayor had no update on his ethics violations.

Comm. Golden stated he will not require the Police Chief to attend meetings; gave explanation of why he would not release information regarding who attended the Police Academy, he gave the costs to attend at \$200.00 dollars per officer, would not give specifics stating security reasons.

Mayor explained a question regarding the vetting of employees, mentioning no name, but that this person is hardworking person, and the Mayor believes in giving a person a second chance stated the police department has their own system for hiring.

Solicitor stated the document of options presented to the commissioners regarding the Ferentz matter has been located by former solicitor Bittner, who stated it is attorney-client privileged, but he would review it to determine if it is releasable and report at the next meeting.

Clerk Donna Frederick explained that there is no borough policy regarding the reporting of delinquent taxes to mortgage companies.

Commissioners thanked everyone for participating in the community clean-up day.

Mayor opened the meeting to floor for public comment.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, requested Comm. Golden to face the audience when answering questions.

LYNN HOCKER, 6 F Avenue, commented she is an election pole worker and was in the tax office when a citizen questioned an employee regarding the election and was told that Amy won, and the election is not yet certified until Friday; stated a range is still out on E Avenue since bulk trash on Oct. 21. Mayor will take care of these items.

DOROTHY DALTON, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned if the borough has a policy regarding delinquent taxes. Mayor stated if a question is raised regarding taxes it will be answered, the borough has no policy regarding delinquent taxes, tax collector follows state statutes.

JOE KLINE, 750 W. Poplar Avenue, directed his question to Comm. Golden, asking if he is in charge of public safety, congratulated the people who went to the police academy, asking the securing reasons for not releasing any information pertaining to the officers who attended, and why he didn't know at the last meeting that officers attended the academy. Comm. Golden stated he would not release the when, where or time due to security reasons, and found out between meeting cycles of the academy attendees.

LEW REMER, 537 W. Pine Avenue, commented the parking distance from stop signs should be shortened. Mayor stated an amendment to the traffic ordinance is being prepares which includes a shortened distance from stop signs and should be in place before the summer season.

MARYANN JOYCE, 546 W. Pine Avenue, commented she has in past meetings asked what is going to be done to correct the flooding issue in front of her home, since the street was raised by the mayor's house. Mayor stated he will be in contact with the engineer and auditor and there are projects for the new year, such as drainage.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, questioned Comm. Golden why the Police Chief will not be attending meetings; questioned where the burglary occurred from the police activity report; asked how many police officers; questioned the amount of tax dollars spent in the police department budget, and for what since on the paid bill list hardly shows anything stating it doesn't add up to half million dollars which is allocated to salaries, vehicles etc.; questioned per the CTWWW request to do bid requests for services.

Comm. Golden stated the public portion of the meeting is for public comments, and does not require questions be answered; at this time he is not requiring the chief to attend meetings; the PD presently has seven officers including the chief; suggested to file an OPRA for the police monies spent. Mayor Fox stated any money not spent gets turned back at the end of the year for surplus for next year budget, and as far a bid requests, as much as the borough can will be done.

MARYELLEN ZAJAK, 753 W. Poplar Avenue, stated the bulkhead at Bay & Poplar Avenue is leaking again and wanted to know is there something in place for properties that have leaking bulkheads. Mayor will have the engineer look at it, and informed her the borough has an ordinance, violations can be sited against the property owners, for failure to maintain it.

JOE KLINE, 750 W. Poplar Avenue, asked if there was a bulkhead height requirement.

Comm. Golden stated yes, 8.5 feet.

MARYANN WELSH, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, asked for an update regarding matters the conflict attorney is handling. Solicitor stated the matter is still pending a hearing needs to be scheduled, discovery needs to be obtained from other agencies. Ms. Welsh asked about the 180-day period for discovery in the Mulhinney matter. Solicitor Blaney clarified in an employment case it is 450-day tract, not 180 days. Ms. Welsh referenced the October meeting stating a citizen asked about an employee who is working for the borough who has past criminal history. Mayor Fox stated he is, and former administrator isn't here to answer however he was young and dumb, and everyone should get a second chance. Ms. Welsh asked for clarification regarding change order 1. Clerk explained resolution authorizing the change order to complete concrete under the ADA ramp at the beach. Ms. Welsh asked about a beach clean-up schedule and equipment. Mayor stated beach is to be worked on from Memorial Day through September, and will not be cleaned in the winter, looking at proper equipment so no one gets injured.

MARYELLEN ZAJAK, 753 W. Poplar Avenue, commented to just use people to clean it up.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, stated no cleaning during the winter. Mayor Fox confirmed no.

DENNIS FIFE, 724 W. Poplar Avenue, stated he heard of reports gun shots fired and asked if the Commissioners knew anything about it. Comm. Golden did know about it. Mayor stated he believes calls came in from the North Wildwood area.

NANCY DOHERTY, 215 R Avenue, addressed the solicitor inquiring about Roberts Rules. Solicitor again explained they are rules of procedure in the running of the meetings, and the borough has a modified version which are adopted in the beginning of the year. Clerk stated the order of business is adopted via resolution and it is OPRAable.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, stated she read about Wildwood Commissioners receiving health insurance, then questioned grandfathering in and the number of hours required to be worked. Mayor stated the law changed in 2010, if you were already receiving benefits and have maintained no break in service you are eligible to keep your benefits, if you had a break in service you were no longer eligible, also there is a fixed number of hours that must be worked, 35 hours from 8-5. Ms. Czwalina stated she can't find information regarding the grandfathering in of people. Solicitor stated it is in the statute.

DOROTHY DALTON, 741 W. Poplar Avenue asked the number of full-time/class II officers on the PD in summer. Comm. Golden stated they must run between seven and eight all year to cover shifts, vacation, etc. Ms. Dalton questioned the number from summer v. winter. Comm. Golden stated eight officers are needed all year.

Hearing no more public comment, the Mayor closed the public portion.

Clerk asked for a motion to adjourn.

AUTHORIZING A SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE CAPE MAY COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY FOR SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL AND RECYCLING SERVICES

WHEREAS, the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority ("CMCMUA"/Authority") owns and operates a solid waste system ("System") which presently serves the entire County of Cape May in the State of New Jersey, for the disposal, transfer, and recycling of solid waste; and

WHEREAS, the CMCMUA's System is comprised of the CMCMUA's Secure Sanitary Landfill, Solid Waste Transfer Station, and Intermediate Processing Facility, as well as several recycling operations and programs; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of West Wildwood has utilized and desires to continue to utilize the services of the CMCMUA's System; and

WHEREAS, there presently exists a contract between the Borough of West Wildwood and the Authority for the use of the CMCMUA's System for the disposal, transfer, and recycling of solid waste which will expire on December 31, 2019 entitled "Shared Services Agreement for Solid Waste Disposal and Recycling Services" (Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough of West Wildwood and the Authority desire to enter into a new agreement and to fix the expiration date of said Agreement to occur on December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has offered the "Shared Services Agreement for Solid Waste Disposal and Recycling Services" to the Borough of West Wildwood in order to more efficiently provide and continue to offer municipalities within Cape May County the use of the CMCMUA's Solid Waste System from January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has submitted the same proposed form of Agreement to all Cape May County Municipalities which will provide for both solid waste disposal and certain recycling services through December 31, 2020; and
