REPORTS FROM COMMISSIONERS:

Mayor stated there was no DPW report for Nov. 2019

Comm. Golden gave the Police Activity Report for Nov. 2019 (Copy attached)

Comm. Korobellis gave the bank balance finance report as of 12/4/19 (copy attached)

Prior to the Mayor opening up the meeting for public comment questions submitted by the Concerned Taxpayers of West Wildwood (CTWWW") were addressed

Per Solicitor Rep. Blaney, in reference to the Mawhinney lawsuit, depositions are in progress and will continue into the new year.

Mayor Fox stated there is no movement on his ethics violations

Conflict counsel is working with the CMC Prosecutor's office there may be issues concerning Brady or Pre-Brady letters, it is a personnel matter which cannot be disclosed.

The Bittner documents, Solicitor Blaney explained that there appeared to have been three resolutions drafted by Ms. Bittner then presented to the commissioners regarding the re-hiring of Chief Ferentz to be considered. Solicitor determined they can be OPRA-able, both Mayor Fox and Comm. Golden are not in favor of releasing it, but Comm. Golden made a motion to release it and Comm. Korobellis seconded the motion. Roll call vote, Comm. Golden, yes; Comm. Korobellis, yes; Mayor Fox, abstain. The document (s) will be release but not waiving any attorney/client privilege.

Deputy Clerk Carl O'Hala gave an update on the Living Shoreline Project, regarding the land acquisition. Mayor Fox express concerns about the monies spent to this point.

Gun shots that were heard and questioned at the last meeting were investigated and deemed to be possible fireworks, Comm. Golden asked if they hear them again to please contact the PD. Mayor stated there was a miscommunication regarding professional appointments (RFQP) for 2020.

Solicitor Blaney clarified the health insurance matter regarding Comm. Golden stating that the statute does not directly say "grandfathered" but explained no break in service makes him eligible to have health insurance.

Comm. Korobellis thanked the residents.

Comm. Golden informed the public the borough received a D.O.T. Grant for A Ave \$185,000.00.

Mayor opened the meeting to floor for public comment.

TRISH SINNOTT, 739 W. Poplar Avenue, congratulated and welcomed Amy, and questioned what the \$75,000.00 improvement account was used for with a break-down of costs; questioned if Carl was taking over the administrator position; and asked what improvements were included for A Avenue Grant .

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, inquired about the DOT grant, Mayor stated it was reimbursable.

MARYANN WELSH, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, commented that a resident has attended several meetings with complaints about water in front of her house and asked if there was a plan in place

for streets. Mayor stated he and the borough engineer has looked at that area, and explained the specific grant is for A Avenue, not Pine Avenue.

JOE KLINE, 750 W. Poplar Avenue, commented on the money spent on the Shoreline Project, and stated funding is more available when the project is shovel ready. Mayor stated that is true, but if the funding does not come through a lot of money has been spend and has concerns over going forward with the project if funding does not become available, and stated Comm. Golden was handling this project. Comm. Golden stated he was not aware that it was costing the borough money.

Mr. Kline questioned the benefit of the project, and to keep pushing. Mayor stated there is a huge benefit, it is a great project that hopefully gets funded.

TRISH SINNOTT, 739 W. Poplar Avenue, commented former administrator Chris Ridings had been talking about this project for over sixteen months and never indicated there were costs, and asked who signs the checks; where is the money going; why move forward is there is only a slim chance, why spend the money. Ms. Sinnott commented that the Mayor and Commissioners were signing the checks.

MARY ELLEN ZAJAC, 753 W. Poplar Avenue, asked the solicitor if there was something in the law to allow access to the property (26th street). Solicitor informed her the procedure is eminent domain, but you must pay compensation to the property owner. Ms. Zajac questioned Comm. Golden regarding last month questioning of hearing gun shots. Comm. Golden stated either fireworks or hunters, an officer will investigate it.

HELEN RAO, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, directed her question to the solicitor if the documents referenced are available. Solicitor stated when Comm. Golden was asked he stated three options were presented, they were three resolutions, the two commissioners selected one and initialed off on the other two not chosen. Ms. Rao questioned the testimony with what was stated. Solicitor believed what was referenced in court was an email between Mary Bittner and Bob DeSanto which is attorney-client privilege and should not have been released. Ms. Rao asked how to get to the bottom who represented it correctly.

TRISH SINNOTT, 739 W. Poplar Avenue, commented it you re-read it attorney Bittner wrote some type of email to cover herself – sounds that way because she was not in agreement, paperwork doesn't support that. Mayor stated the only documents signed are these documents three resolutions, two draft resolutions initialed by commissioners.

HELEN RAO, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned the signed checks for the cost of the living shoreline and asked over what timeline. Deputy Clerk stated there were ten checks over two years. Ms. Rao stating why would the Mayor and Commissioners continue paying expenses for over two years and why sign the checks if you thought there was no cost, and are we going to continue to pay. Mayor stated he would stop it today if chances were slim, it wouldn't be worth it, but he was ok spending the money.

TRISH SINNOTT, 739 W. Poplar Avenue, commented that it was a costly misunderstanding between the Mayor and Administrator Ridings over the funding costs, and asked if the

commissioners get together to discuss this as a group. Solicitor stated two commissioners are a quorum and they can't make decisions or talk it must be done if public. Mayor stated this project started through Scott Golden. Comm. Golden stated the borough is hoping NOAA provides grant money. Deputy Clerk Carl O'Hala informed the public that the Army Corps and Conservancy are one hundred percent behind this project, and he is attending meetings and hoping to find funding.

Ms. Sinnott stated congratulation on updating of the master plan. Mayor Fox informed her the master plan has not yet been adopted due to outstanding COAH matters which will be incorporated into the new master plan. Solicitor explained the Mount Laurel Plan, purpose to avoid litigation by having a COAH plan.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, asked why COAH fees were refunded. Mayor stated they should not have been collected. Mayor stated you want a mix in every town, COAH plan to fit, one out of five homes or twenty percent for COAH. Deputy Clerk stated he was directed by the Mayor to find out about our neighboring towns, Wildwood Crest has an area of overlay for COAH; North Wildwood does not; City of Wildwood does, but in any event, compliance must be done. Mayor stated Carl did a good job with this matter.

MARY ELLEN ZAJAC, 753 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned if the Mayor referenced something about pre-brady letter. Mayor stated he didn't mention brady. Solicitor explained the borough hired conflict counsel who is working with the Prosecutor's office that did involve Brady issues, which are related to an officer's truthfulness, there is a disciplinary matter and it can't be discussed.

TRISH SINNOTT, 739 W. Poplar Avenue asked it there are any great changes in the master plan; and staffing changes in the office, or internally; questioned replacement of Chris Ridings; bid process for professionals. Mayor stated nothing in stone. Clerk stated the engineer went to bid and awarded a three-year appointment. Ms. Sinnott commented that the Mayor stated in a previous meeting he was disappointed with the ramp and asked about it. Mayor discussed it with borough engineer Jim Oris. Ms. Sinnott asked about professional appointments of Auditors, Legal & Labor Counsel. Solicitor stated the Sunshine Law requires decisions must be made at a public meeting. Mayor stated employees are hired by individual commissioner. Comm. Golden stated matters are discussed at workshops. Ms. Sinnott welcomed Comm. Amy Korobellis and asked about her objectives for the borough; commented on the voting card sent out by the CTWWW stating she changed her mind to be included with the names of all candidates; asked if she was friends with the Fox family. Comm. Korobellis stated she would get back to her about specific objectives, but was looking forward to next year working together with the residents, Mayor and Commissioner; stated she went out on her own, ran independently and stated that not once was she asked if she was friends with the Fox's; she was asked if she was part of that group, whatever that meant; stated she has lived here twenty years, raised her children and wishes to pull together as residents and taxpayers.

DEB FOX, 634 W. Poplar Avenue, stated Amy and she have been friends since their kids were born. Comm. Korobellis stated she took this on her own and asked why we can't all pull together; continued stating she walked around the island, met a lot of people; stated she is the assistant manger at the Wildwood Crest Library; raised three children, is divorced.

TRISH SINNOTT, 739 W. Poplar Avenue, stated they shared a great conversation.

MARY ELLEN ZAJAC, 753 W. Poplar Avenue, asked Comm. Korobellis is she was an independent thinker. Comm. Korobellis stated she doesn't need anybody to steer her in anyway. Ms. Zajac asked is anyone was filling Chris Ridings position. Mayor stated Solicitor stated that position depends on the form of government, the statute provides for it at the pleasure of the governing body, provides for a three-month severance package.

MARY ANN WELSH, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, asked about the COAH fees when a house is built. Mayor explained the fees and the expense.

HELEN RAO, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, asked clerk the cost of conflict counsel, clerk will get that amount.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, asked if in 2020 the meetings could go back to Friday evenings. Comm. Korobellis stated Friday nights are not good for her. Ms. Czwalina asked about Monday night. Comm. Korobellis stated she works until 8:00pm. Ms. Czwalina questioned both Comm. Golden and Mayor Fox regarding meeting times. Comm. Golden stated he is okay with Wednesdays at 3:00 or 5:00pm. Mayor is ok with Wednesday. It was decided to have the January regular meeting on the 8th at 7:00pm. Clerk confirmed January 8, 2020 at 7:00pm and will properly advertise it.

Ms. Czwalina questioned shared services that were discussed at the workshop meeting; questioned to go to Wildwood Crest or North Wildwood for shared service; questioned 2020 taxes; reduction in school taxes; commented on the trash collection cost; the judgement and what is the estimated surplus. Mayor Fox explained the borough was in negotiations with Wildwood for shared services; was going to be sitting down with the auditors and hopes not to have a tax increase stating taxes didn't go up in the last two years. Ms. Czwalina asked Comm. Korobellis if sub-committees could be set up, stating there are a lot of people with talent, and asked to talk to them; questioned the costs for the telephone, stating she doesn't see savings based on the paid bills. Mayor stated Amy has a lot to learn and hasn't even met the auditor yet.\

MATT KSIAZEK, 538 W. Magnolia Avenue, congratulated Amy and wished everyone a happy new year, commented about the rhetoric discussed at previous meeting regarding group against group and family against family and believes it is poisoning the community and hopes we move forward in 2020.

Hearing no more public comment, the Mayor closed the public portion. Clerk asked for a motion to adjourn.

ORDINANCE 576 (2019)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST WILDWOOD, COUNTY OF CAPE MAY AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY TO SELL BOROUGH OWNED LAND TO CONTIGUOUS OWNERS OF BLOCK 176, LOT 1

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Commission of the Borough of West Wildwood, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey that it is necessary that Borough owned land be sold to a contiguous owners.

SECTION 1.

WHEREAS, New Jersey Statute 40A:12-13 provides the procedure for the sale of Borough owned land, and allows for a private sale of land by ordinance when the sale is to the owner of the real property contiguous to the Borough owned parcel, provided that the property being sold is less than the minimum size required for development under the municipal zoning ordinance and is without any capital improvement thereon; and also provided that any such sale shall be for not less than the fair market value of the real property; and

WHEREAS, the Borough owns a parcel of land identified as Block 176, Lot 1 a parcel of land and is approximately 844 sq. feet; and

WHEREAS, the assessment of the parcel is \$16,880.00.00, and the Borough Tax Assessor has stated in writing that the fair market value of the land is \$16,880.00; and

WHEREAS, the statute also requires that the borough file with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs, sworn affidavits verifying the publications of advertisements for the Ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED,

- 1. The Borough Commission of the Borough of West Wildwood shall sell the portion of real property identified as Block 176, Lot 1; and
 - 2. The property being sold herein is being sold "As Is / Where Is".
- 3. Buyer shall agree to be solely responsible for all costs and legal responsibilities incurred to purchase property and must file a deed of consolidation.
 - 4. Transfer of title from Borough to Buyer will be by a Quit Claim deed.
 - 5. The purchase price shall be \$16,880.00; and
- 6. That the Clerk or the Clerk's representative is to file the necessary affidavits with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, and
- 7. The Mayor, Clerk, and any and all other Borough Officials, are hereby authorized to sign those documents necessary to effectuate this transaction; and
- 8. Buyer shall be responsible for Borough Counsel's fee of \$500.00 plus, the cost of preparation of deed.
 - 9. Buyer shall pay all other costs associated with the transfer
- **SECTION 2.** All other ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency.
- SECTION 3. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of Page 2 of 3

this ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication, according to law.

AUTHORIZING THE REFUND OF COAH FEES COLLECTED

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners passed Ordinance 544(2015) on July 2, 2015 establishing standards for the collection, maintenance and expenditure of development fees pursuant to the Department of Community Affairs (Herein referred to as "Department") regulations and in accordance with P.L. 2008, c 46, Sections 8 and 32-38; and

WHEREAS, the fees collected pursuant to the adoption of the aforementioned ordinance shall be used for the sole purpose of providing low and moderate income housing and shall be interpreted within the framework of the Department's rules on development fees, codified at N.J.A.C. 5:97-8; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of West Wildwood has a Shared Services Agreement with the City of Wildwood for Uniform Construction Code services; and

WHEREAS, the City of Wildwood Construction Official responsible for the issuance of a building permit shall notify the local tax assessor of the issuance of the first building permit for a development which is subject to a development fee; and

WHEREAS, the expenditure of all funds shall conform to a spending plan approved by the Department for implementation of the Housing Element and Fair Share Plan or any other activity as permitted pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:97-8.7 through 8.9 and specified in the approved spending plan; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of West Wildwood spending plan is pending approval; and
