# Reports from Commissioners:

Mayor gave the DPW report for the month of July 2020 (copy attached).

Comm. Korobellis gave an account balance summary as of August 20, 2020 (copy attached)

Comm. Golden gave the PD report for the month of July 2020. (copy attached).

Prior to opening the meeting for public comment Mayor Fox asked for clarification regarding Resolutions 2020-066 and 2020-067, stating the numbers seem to be reversed and asked the solicitor if there is a clerical error if it was okay to still move forward if it is noted rather than the need to have an additional meeting to correct it if indeed it is reversed. Solicitor stated if it were a clerical error it would be okay to make the change without the need for another meeting.

Mayor thanked the Clerk, clerk's office, CFO and Solicitor for their hard work involving the road project since there were huge deadlines involved, the clerk came in and was supposed to be on vacation. Mayor Fox stated the borough was one of only three NJ towns to get money and West Wildwood got the most of all the towns, he commended everyone.

The second thing Mayor Fox stated was to clarify the disturbing spout-offs about beach fees; charging for parking and changing the beach name, these are absolute lies, these were never

talked about, they just want to take a small town and destroy it, they are lies. Comm. Korobellis stated she was taken back with a phone call about changing the beach name and charging beach tags, it was never discussed and she has referred to it as the West Wildwood Beach, her children call it the Little Beach, it was disturbing. Comm. Golden stated both commissioners covered it, it is just false rumors that were clarified tonight, and stated don't believe what you read.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, thanked Bill Null for assistance during the storm, and thanked the Mayor. Ms. Czwalina asked for the next bulk trash date; community clean-up date; and when in person meetings would start and to consider changing the meetings back to Friday's at 7:00pm. Clerk informed her bulk trash is Monday, October 19, 2020. Mayor stated no date has been set for the clean community's day he still has concerns over social distancing. Mayor stated he had discussions with the clerk regarding borough meetings, and given the social distancing spacing the hall would only allow for twenty-five people and he feels it is unfair to other people who may be turned away, you have to be careful, zoom is safer and people one hundred miles away can participate. Comm. Korobellis agrees, as a county employee there are not regular meetings, they are by zoom, the safety of residents is important with zoom everyone can participate, and she doesn't like the idea of turning people away. Comm. Golden stated both commissioners covered it, safety is priority. Mayor stated he is open minded to changing the meetings but hasn't considered it lately. Ms. Czwalina asked to follow up on the meeting change next meeting. Ms. Czwalina questioned resolution 2020-065 for the award of the construction contract; asked who got it; how many bids; and how the contractor was chosen. Mayor stated Lexa Concrete was the lowest bidder out of (he believes) seven bidders. Ms. Czwalina questioned who put in petitions to run in the upcoming election. Clerk said the deadline for filing petitions is August 31, 2020 at 4:00pm and the information would be available after the deadline. Ms. Czwalina asked if there were any new lawsuits or any current suits. Solicitor stated no new lawsuits, and nothing that she would consider a lawsuit, there is still the action in court for the COAH settlement.

HELEN RAO, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, questioned items from the police activity report, asking how property checks are determined and do they leave a note. Comm. Golden stated in some cases in the past notes were left, and checks can be random, but he will clarify that with the Chief. Ms. Rao questioned the Meghan's Law violation registered. Comm. Golden stated he wasn't one hundred percent sure but believes a sex offender must register with the police department when they move in or stay in town and stated the Mayor would know more. Mayor stated there are tier levels to the degree of the offense. Ms. Rao questioned the mayor regarding his hearing and what county will it be heard. Mayor stated nothing is scheduled, some arguing over motions and he believes Superior Court in Atlantic County.

MARYANN WELSH, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, asked for any updates on the living shoreline. Mayor stated there is no update, the property owner at the end of 26<sup>th</sup> Street has some DEP issues, she won't allow us to cross the property, it is at an absolute stand still. Ms. Welsh asked if TRIAD could help with grants to secure the property. Mayor stated deputy clerk has been checking into grant money, and financing, and if the borough doesn't get the funding he is looking into different directions, possibly dredging the Poplar Avenue canal, it's a longshot and will take a lot of time, but he has feelers and looking into it. Mayor stated this started under Comm. Golden. Comm. Golden stated the Stevenson Institute did the design work pro-bona, and

has tried twice to get funding from NOAA, but until the DEP issues are resolved no one will look at funding it. Ms. Welsh questioned the information from an article regarding the property freeze possibly being cancelled and asked how many property owners would be impacted and asked the clerk to email her the information. Ms. Welsh asked how the tax freeze works if the borough gets one hundred percent upfront or reimbursed. Ms. Welsh asked if the borough has voter registration forms. Clerk stated yes. Mayor stated the Cape May County Prosecutor's office will be keeping a check for fraudulent voters registering and voting, checking where you pay taxes and looking at license plates.

HELEN RAO, 741 W. Poplar Avenue, commented with the upcoming elections can the borough hold a zoom meeting for the candidates for residents to get to know them. Mayor deferred to the solicitor, stating that is political. Solicitor stated the mayor is right, that is political. Mayor stated you have to be careful because of borough operations, it is political.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, asked the status of the police ramp, commenting you can't get the grant money for the beach ramp until the police ramp is completed. Mayor stated he has met with the engineers regarding the design and cost estimate on the project, it may take another bond issue to complete it. Ms. Czwalina stated she was concerned about getting the money in the coffers.

Hearing no more public comment, the Mayor closed the public portion. Clerk asked for a motion to adjourn.
