Reports from Commissioners:

Mayor gave the DPW report for the month of January 2023 (copy attached). Mayor reported on upgrades to the modem to 4G at the bridge sign; borough took delivery of the new dump truck; working on disposal of old vehicles; police ADA ramp is completed. Mayor stated the new trash hauler is going well, and reminded residents to get their trash out to the curb by 7:00am. Mayor updated on UEZ projects for 2023 which include bike racks/trash receptacles and hopes to install by spring.

Comm. Banning gave the police activity report for January 2023 (copy attached).

Comm. Segrest gave the finance report as of February 3, 2023 (copy attached). Comm. Segrest explained the resolution regarding the local finance board, for purposes to seek relief from the required down payment, the borough wouldn't get full credit of grant funds. This meeting will take place on March 8 and the second reading and public hearing on the bond ordinance would be at the workshop meeting on March 15 at 9:00am. Comm. Segrest gave updates on the completion of manhole repairs a total of 48 have been either replaced, rehabilitated or curtain grouted. Comm. Segrest explained the possibility of contracting to put acoustic sensors in manholes to detect flow directions to help guide the borough for future repairs to the sewer system. Comm. Segrest reported on the tax collection rate over 98%; annual financial statement is on the borough website; draft budget in progress and hoping to introduce on March 3 meeting; fair-share housing program has collected a considerable amount for developer fees and three renovations are obligated to be completed in a five year period, and inspector will need to be hired to inspect and make sure the work is up to code, and is hoping to implement an outreach program to the residents. The program is based on income, moderate for a single person is \$48,000 and approx. \$7,000 for each additional resident.

Comm. Segrest announce the County of Cape May has provide an opportunity to apply for \$400,000 from their portion of the American Rescue Plan Act covid funds. A discussion of idea ensued and will be further discussed at the workshop meeting.

Comm. Segrest reported the living shoreline and flood study is in FEMA hands, waiting to hear about funding by the end of the year. Comm. Segrest discussed the floodplain management ordinance which will help with our CRS program but is being held up from implementation by the NJDEP. Mayor Ksiazek stated this will be further discussed at the workshop meeting.

Mayor opened the meeting for public comment.

BILL KAPAC, 217 R Avenue, inquired about the upcoming Maple Avenue project improvements as he owns a property in the 600 block just off of Neptune and Maple Avenue. Mayor & Comm. Segrest stated it will be a fall project and once the street is paved and complete there will be a moratorium on digging it up. Mr. Kapac will meet with Donna to check the maps.

SUSAN CZWALINA, 547 W. Maple Avenue, asked about resolution 008, who was appointed as the zoning official. Mayor stated Brian Vergantino. Ms. Czwalina questioned if there are any new litigation issues. Solicitor stated the only one, a tax appeal has been resolved. Ms. Czwalina inquired about the manhole project; the USDA grant amount; fair share housing program areas; and how much is in the fund. Susan presented a check from the Concerned Taxpayers donation of \$215.00 to the beautification fund.

DAVE CULLEN, 614 W. Maple Avenue, asked who owns the land by the dirt road back by the public works area. Comm. Segrest stated the borough owns where the old railroad was and a private person owns the area where the boats are and beyond the bar, marsh area is privately owned. Comm. Segrest is hoping to possibly utilize that area for public use after the phase 2 study is completed.

Hearing no more public comment, Mayor closed the public portion of the meeting. Clerk asked for a motion to adjourn.

ORDINANCE NO. 606(2023)

AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO THE ENTERPRISE ZONE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION OF THE WILDWOODS

WHEREAS, New Jersey's Urban Enterprise Zone (UEZ) Program, enacted in 1983, is an Affiliate of the Department of Community Affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Program's charter is to foster an economic climate that revitalizes designated urban communities and stimulates their growth by encouraging businesses to develop and create private sector jobs through public and private investment; and

WHEREAS, P.L. 2021, Chapter 197 was enacted by the New Jersey Legislature on June 24, 2021, which, among other things, extends the Urban Enterprise Zone (UEZ) Program for 10 years, prohibits the creation of new zones, limits Sales Tax exempt purchases made by UEZ businesses, and eliminates employee tax credits for new applicants; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of West Wildwood to incorporate those statutory provisions as adopted by the New Jersey Legislature.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of West Wildwood in the County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section One.

§ 24-1. JOINT ENTERPRISE ZONE CORPORATION.

§ 24-1.1. Findings.

Amendments to the New Jersey Urban Enterprise Zones Act, N.J.S.A. 52:27H-1, et seq. (the "Act"), have been adopted and the effect of one or more of those amendments is to create a joint enterprise zone located in the City of North Wildwood, the City of Wildwood, the Borough of Wildwood Crest and the Borough of West Wildwood; and

Pursuant to said Act, the governing body of a qualifying municipality must create a nonprofit corporation to formulate and propose a preliminary zone development plan and to thereafter coordinate and administer the activities of the municipality, zone businesses and community organizations within the designated enterprise zone.

The joint designation of the City of North Wildwood, the City of Wildwood, Borough of Wildwood Crest and Borough of West Wildwood requires the creation of a nonprofit zone development corporation by all four municipalities in order to implement the Joint Urban Enterprise Zone.

§ 24-1.2. Authorization to Incorporate.

The City of Wildwood is hereby authorized to act as an incorporator with the City of North Wildwood, Borough of Wildwood Crest and Borough of West Wildwood to create a nonprofit corporation to be known as the Enterprise Zone Development Corporation of the Wildwoods, and the Mayor and City

Clerk of the City of Wildwood are hereby authorized to execute a Certificate of Incorporation containing provisions authorized by and consistent with this section. The Clerk of the City of Wildwood is further authorized to jointly file with the Clerks of the City of North Wildwood, Borough of Wildwood Crest and Borough of West Wildwood the Certificate of Incorporation authorized by this section after execution by the appropriate officials of all four municipalities.

§ 24-1.3. Purpose.

The purposes to be included in the Certificate of Incorporation pursuant to N.J.S.A. 15A:1-1 et seq. the New Jersey Nonprofit Corporation Act, shall include the following:

- a. To formulate and propose a preliminary zone development plan to the governing bodies of the Cities of North Wildwood and Wildwood and the Boroughs of Wildwood Crest and West Wildwood, setting forth the boundaries of the proposed enterprise zone in all four municipalities, setting forth findings of fact concerning the economic and social conditions existing in the area proposed in the joint enterprise zone, and setting forth each municipalities' policy and intentions for addressing the conditions in said joint enterprise zone.
- b. To utilize the powers conferred by the New Jersey Urban Enterprise Zone Act for the purpose of stimulating investment in, and economic development of, the proposed joint enterprise zone.
- c. To utilize state assistance through the provisions of the New Jersey Urban Enterprise Zone Act relating to exemptions from, and credits against, state taxes.
- d. To secure the involvement in, and commitment to, zone economic development by private entities, including zone neighborhood associations, voluntary community organizations supported by residents and businesses in said joint enterprise zone.
- e. To make recommendations for the revision of municipal planning and zoning ordinances and other land use regulations as they pertain to the joint enterprise zone for all four municipalities, so that they each may use the powers conferred by law to enhance the attractions of the joint enterprise zone to prospective developers.
- f. To increase the availability and efficiency of support services, public and private, generally used by and necessary to the efficient functioning of commercial and industrial facilities in the area, to the extent to which the increase or improvement is to be provided and financed by the four municipalities or by other entities.
- g. To take such additional action, not inconsistent with the New Jersey Urban Enterprise Zone Act, as the board of directors of the Enterprise Zone Development Corporation deems necessary for the development, administration and coordination of activities in the joint enterprise zone for the benefit of zone businesses and community organizations within said joint enterprise zone, for the ultimate purpose of the economic betterment of the residents of said zone and the participating municipalities.

§ 24-1.4. Board of Directors.

The Board of Directors shall consist of eight (8) members, as follows:

a. One member of the local government from each of the municipalities of Wildwood, North Wildwood, Wildwood Crest and West Wildwood, each of whom shall serve as Chairman of the Board of Directors for one year and whose term on the Board of Directors shall run concurrent with his or her term as an elected official. The local government member from each municipality, at the option of each

municipality and as evidenced by a resolution of the governing body of municipality, shall be either the Mayor or member of the governing body of the municipality as chosen by the affirmative vote of all of the members of the governing body of the municipality.

- b. The City Administrator, Business Administrator, City Manager and/or Administrative designee of each municipality shall also serve on the Board of Directors for a period of one year, renewed annually at reorganization by the affirmative vote of all of the members of the governing body of the municipality.
 - c. (Reserved)

§ 24-1.5. Duration of Corporation.

The Board of Directors shall have authority to dissolve the corporation upon the revocation of the UEZ designation or upon the approval of all members of the Board of Directors. Dissolution of the corporation shall be in accordance with N.J.S.A. 15A:12-1 et seq.

§ 24-1.6. Bylaws; Enterprise Zone Coordinator.

The directors of the corporation shall develop bylaws for the corporation, which shall include an executive officer to be known as the enterprise zone coordinator. The board shall develop qualifications for the zone coordinator and shall thereafter appoint a coordinator who meets said qualifications for a term not to exceed four years. The board may thereafter reappoint the same individual as zone coordinator for successive terms, provided that no term shall exceed four years. The board shall also hire such administrative personnel as may be necessary for the efficient operation of the Enterprise Zone Corporation. Upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the board of directors of the corporation, the board may engage the services of such professional persons as may be necessary for the efficient operation of the Enterprise Zone Corporation, but not for extraordinary purposes as contemplated in Section 24-1.7 below.

§ 24-1.7. Approvals Required by Board.

All ordinary business conducted by the Enterprise Zone Development Corporation shall be approved by a simple majority of those board members who are present at any regular or special meeting of the board of directors. However, amendments to the Enterprise Zone Development Corporation's bylaws, modification of zone boundaries, proposals for projects to receive money from the Zone Assistance Fund, the hiring of an enterprise zone coordinator and the hiring of professional, technical and consultant personnel shall require that the project or proposal, or the amendment has received unanimous support by way of resolution from each municipality and a two-thirds vote of the board of directors of the corporation.

§ 24-1.8. Zone Assistance Fund.

Each of the four participating municipalities shall be obligated to contribute annually to the Urban Enterprise Zone total budget for administration salary and wage and other expenses, with 10% of each municipality's Zone Assistance Funds for a fiscal year being the amount contributed. Any deficits in administrative funds shall be borne by each municipality based upon the percentage contributions to the total administrative budget and any surpluses in administrative funds shall be returned to each municipality for use as Zone Assistance Funds based upon the percentage contributions to the total administrative budget.

§ 24-1.9. (Reserved)

§ 24-1.10. Distribution of Assets Upon Termination of Corporation.

Upon the termination of the corporation, the corporation's assets shall be distributed to all four municipalities on a pro-rata basis, in proportion to the funds generated from within each municipality and received or collected by the corporation during the corporation's existence.

§ 24-1.11. Certificate of Incorporation.

- a. The Certificate of Incorporation shall include the address of the corporation's initial registered office, which may be the office of the City Clerk of the City of Wildwood, and the name of the corporation's initial registered agent at that address, as required by the New Jersey Nonprofit Corporation Act. Thereafter, the board of directors may change the corporation's registered office and the corporation's registered agent consistent with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 15A:1-1 et seq.
- b. The Certificate of Incorporation shall also contain the names and address of the first board of directors of the corporation, and such additional information as may be required by the New Jersey Nonprofit Corporation Act.

§ 24-2. DESIGNATION AS URBAN ENTERPRISE ZONE.

§ 24-2.1. Findings.

The State of New Jersey has adopted legislation creating certain areas within certain cities as Urban Enterprise Zones. The State of New Jersey has adopted amending legislation which provides for a joint zone located in four municipalities which are adjacent to each other in a county of the sixth class. Cape May County is a county of the sixth class and the municipalities of Wildwood, North Wildwood, West Wildwood, Wildwood Crest are adjacent to each other, are situate in a county of the sixth class and otherwise meet the population criteria that is in the aforementioned amending legislation. The municipalities of Wildwood, North Wildwood, West Wildwood and Wildwood Crest have been designated for Joint Enterprise Zone; and under said legislation the Urban Enterprise Zone Authority was created for the purpose of examining particular areas in cities and designating these cities as Joint Enterprise Zone. The City of Wildwood, by resolution, did seek to have certain areas designated along with the City of North Wildwood, Borough of West Wildwood, and the Borough of Wildwood Crest as a Joint Enterprise Zone, and did seek to have zone plan approved by the Authority. Representatives of the Urban Enterprise Zone Authority did designate the areas set forth in the said municipalities of the City of Wildwood and the City of North Wildwood and the Borough of West Wildwood and the Borough of Wildwood Crest as Urban Enterprise Zones and did approve the application of said municipalities as authorized by the aforesaid resolution.

§ 24-2.2. Acceptance of Designation of Urban Enterprise Zone.

The City of Wildwood hereby accepts the designation of Urban Enterprise Zone, pursuant to the joint application approved by the Urban Enterprise Zone Authority of the State of New Jersey on July 10, 2002.

Section 2. Severability

If any provision of this Ordinance or the application of such provision to any person or circumstance is declared invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the other provisions or applications of this Ordinance which can be given effect, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

Section 3. Repealer

This Ordinance shall supersede all other Ordinances in conflict with same which, to the extent they conflict with this Ordinance, are hereby repealed.

Section 4. Effective Date

The Ordinance shall take affect 20 days subsequent to second reading and final passage.

ORDINANCE NO. 607(2023)

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF THE SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM ON MAPLE AVENUE IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF WEST WILDWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$2,875,100 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,875,100 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO FINANCE THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIOINERS OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST WILDWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of West Wildwood, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey (the "Borough") as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a), there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$2,875,100, including a grant in the amount of \$1,284,100 from the United States Department of Agriculture (the "USDA Grant") and a loan in the amount of \$1,591,000 from the United States Department of Agriculture. No down payment is required pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c) as this bond ordinance authorizes obligations solely for a purpose described in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-7(d) as more fully explained in Section 6(e) of this bond ordinance.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvement or purpose and in anticipation of receipt of the USDA Grant, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$2,875,100 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for the financing of which the bonds are to be issued is the replacement of the sanitary sewer system on Maple Avenue, including, but not limited to, new sewer mains, manholes and laterals and further including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvement or purpose is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date, unless such bond anticipation notes are permitted to mature at such later date in accordance with applicable law. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation

notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law or other applicable law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The Borough hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement or purpose that the Borough may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.

- (b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 40 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$2,875,100, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$825,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement.
- (e) This bond ordinance authorizes obligations of the Borough solely for a purpose described in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-7(d). This purpose is in the public interest and is for the health, welfare, convenience or betterment of the inhabitants of the Borough. The amounts to be expended for this purpose pursuant to this bond ordinance are not unreasonable or exorbitant, and the issuance of the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will not materially impair the credit of the Borough or substantially reduce its ability to pay punctually the principal of and the interest on its debts and to supply other essential public improvements and services. The Local Finance Board in the Division of Local Government Services of the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New

Jersey has heretofore made a determination to this effect and has caused its consent to be endorsed upon a certified copy of this bond ordinance as passed upon first reading.

Section 7. The Borough hereby declares the intent of the Borough to issue bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of the Treasury Regulations.

Section 8. Any grant moneys received for the purpose described in Section 3(a) hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 9. The chief financial officer of the Borough is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Borough and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough fails to comply with its

undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SETTLEMENT OF TAX APPEAL FILED BY WILLIAM J. AND RENEE HAGSTOTZ FOR THE PROPERTY KNOWN AS 623 WEST POPLAR AVE,, BLOCK 106, LOT 15, ON THE TAX MAPS OF WEST WILDWOOD BOROUGH

WHEREAS, William J. and Renee Hagstotz ("Taxpayers") are the owners of the property commonly known as 623 West Poplar Ave. and identified as Block 106, Lot 15 on the Tax Maps of West Wildwood Borough ("Property"); and

WHEREAS, the assessed value of the Property was set at \$958,200.00 for the 2021 tax year;

WHEREAS, the Taxpayers filed an appeal of the 2021 tax assessment in the Tax Court of the State of New Jersey under Docket No. 011099-2021; and

WHEREAS, a proposed settlement of the aforesaid tax appeal was negotiated between the Taxpayers, the Taxpayers' Attorney, the Taxpayers' Appraiser, the Borough's Tax Assessor, the Borough's Appraiser, and the Borough Attorney as follows:

- 2021 and 2022 Assessments reduced to \$895,000, for a refund (to be determined by the Borough Tax Collector) payable as a credit applied against the next due quarterly real estate taxes on the Property after the issuance of a judgment by the Tax Court.
- The Borough shall not adjust the assessment for the 2023, 2024, 2025, or 2026 Tax Years unless such is done in connection with an added assessment or municipal-wide revaluation or reassessment. An added assessment shall only be applied if the fair market cost of improvements exceed \$50,000.00.

WHEREAS, the Tax Assessor and Borough Attorney agrees it is in the best interests of the Borough to resolve the aforesaid tax appeal pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth above based on market conditions as well as the uncertainty and costs associated with continued litigation, including expert fees, deposition fees, and attorneys' fees; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid settlement is based on the specific and identifiable facts and circumstances pertaining to the Property and has no general application to other properties within the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Commissioners having reviewed and considered the pending tax appeal and the proposed settlement thereof agrees and confirms it is in the best interests of the Borough to resolve the tax appeal as set forth herein; and



Tax Collector Report

Operating Budget

The annual debt statement and annual financial statement are being finalized. Once they are complete the draft budget will be compiled for the commissioners to review. We expect to introduce the budget at the March 3rd meeting.

Sewer Utility

Repairs for the second set of manholes completed last week. To date we have accomplished repair actions on 48 of the approximately 100 manholes.

Renovation of three additional manholes is in the planning stage and hope to have them done before summer.

We are discussing flow measurement tests by a contractor using acoustic sensors to narrow down the areas of our major leaks.

Fair Share Housing Program

We met with TRIAD on outreach plans to meet our 3 rehabilitation unit goal for our current 5 year agreement. There are some specific program information documents we need to develop and then some broad advertisement with focused outreach in our community.
